Course Name and Code: Choir (922604, 929615, 926015, 928916, 928915)

Supplementary Texts or Special Materials: Various Choral Octavos, 1" black three ring binder, two sharpened pencils at every class.

Course Description

Students will study, sing and perform varied choral literature as a means of advancing their vocal technique, musicianship, and understanding of musical theory. Students will sing music in an array of styles from various cultures and time periods, and develop an understanding of how music relates to history and culture. The Westfield High School Choral Program also encourages small and large group cooperation, leadership opportunities, and school spirit.

Learning Goals

Students of the Westfield High School Choral Program will...

- Become skillful and acute listeners.
- Develop and use critical thinking skills.
- Become kind, caring and positive ensemble members.
- Strengthen individual vocal technique.
- Become competent users of musical notation.
- Broaden their understanding of the musical world.

Rehearsal Technique

Students are taught appropriate rehearsal technique as part of chorus class. Each student is evaluated daily on their use of proper rehearsal technique during class and will receive a weekly Rehearsal Technique grade. Rehearsal technique includes classroom and rehearsal procedures as well as using proper vocal technique.

Vocal Health and Duress

Choir classes require students to sing and participate each day in rehearsal. You are expected to keep your voice healthy so you are able to participate in class. Drink plenty of water and get enough rest. Try not to yell or strain your voice. If a student is unable to sing due to illness or other vocal strain, he or she is still expected to participate in class to the fullest extent possible, including staying focused on the music being studied, making all markings, etc. Please communicate any issues with the Director prior to class.

Procedures, Prohibited Behaviors, and Tips for Success

Procedures

- 1. Arrive on time and prepared.
- 2. Observe instructions on the board.
- 3. Pick up any BOPs, forms, new music or assignments for the day.
- 4. Sit in assigned seat and be ready to sing when the bell rings.
- 5. Pay attention to important class and school announcements.
- 6. Perform to the very best of your ability during every class.
- 7. Listen to and follow directions the first time they are given.
- 8. Request after class time for personal matters, suggestions, and discussions.
- 9. Keep the choir room, auditorium, and any practice space clean and functional.
- 10. Be respectful of those around you.

Unwelcome Behavior

- 1. Interrupting the flow of rehearsal.
- 2. Defacing (drawing/writing on) classroom items or materials.
- 3. Talking while others are singing or teaching.
- 4. Using cell phones/tablets/laptops during rehearsal.
- 5. Lethargic, half-hearted, non-caring work
- 6. Giving up when something is hard.
- 7. Neglecting to clean up after yourself
- 8. Disrespectful language, actions, gestures or attitudes.
- 9. Violent gestures or threats, even when in jest.
- 10. Chewing gum and or eating during rehearsal.

Tips for Success

- 1. Keep a positive attitude and an open mind.
- 2. Bring a water bottle with you to class, and fill it up BEFORE rehearsal.
- 3. If you sent Mrs. Pierce an email the night before or over the weekend, check with her before class to see if she received it before assuming she has had a chance to read it.
- 4. Mrs. Pierce is always here for you if you have a question or a concern, but you may be have to be patient. If she can't talk to you right then and there, then schedule a time when she can.
- 5. Save homework, personal matters, cell phones, etc for before or after rehearsal has started. Waiting for people to put away their phones or textbooks slows down the class and is disrespectful to teachers and other singers.

As my high school chorus teacher used to say... "This class isn't an easy A. But if you are present in class, focused, and love what you are getting to do, you will get an A easily."

Grading Procedures

Grading System (Including Assessment for Learning)

Grades for each marking period will be based on the following: weekly rehearsal technique grade, classroom assignments, performance in concerts, and written assessments.

Concerts and performances are summative grades, the pinnacle of classroom work; therefore, these grades will be worth 40% of the Course Grade.

Grades will be averaged together with a letter grade established according to Fairfax County Public schools policy.

Attendance Policy

It is extremely important to be present physically and mentally, in all rehearsals and performances. There is no way to make up the experience gained from rehearsing with the group, and even one missing singer can have dramatic effects on the rest of the ensemble.

Concerts and performances are the culmination of classroom work, therefore, all performances are graded and mandatory unless otherwise noted. Students are responsible for making arrangements to attend each performance. This includes adjusting work schedules and arranging transportation to and from the concert. Students must be picked up in a timely manner following the concert, as school staff may not leave the building until all students are picked up. Students should inform Ms. Pierce as early as possible should a conflict arise.

Should a student be absent from a performance, an alternate written assignment may be given after consulting with the appropriate parties.

Make-up Work and Late Assignments Other than Performances

All students are expected to complete all missed work when absent. If the student has an absence on a day when work is due, he or she is expected to turn the work in the following class. In the event of more than one class absence, the student should see the teacher to determine when work will be due. When the absence is unexcused, students will receive 50% of the score earned on all assignment and assessment. Late assignments will be accepted in the following manner:

One day late – deduction of 10% from earned score
Two days late – deduction of 20% from earned score
Three days late – deduction of 30% from earned score
Four days late – deduction of 40% from earned score
Five or more days late – deduction of 50% from earned score

Westfield High School Honor Code

Course Descriptions

<u>Chamber Singers</u> is an artist-level mixed choir. Students will perform at school concerts and events, community events, ceremonies, and competitions. The ensemble studies and performs challenging music in all styles and languages. Students must have advanced singing, sight reading, and musicianship skills in order to be in Chamber Singers. Membership in the group is by audition only for grades 10 - 12. \$Course Fee\$

<u>Bel Canto</u> is an advanced-level women's choir. The ensemble studies and performs challenging music in all styles and languages. Students will advance in sight-singing, vocal production, and musicianship. Students will perform at school concerts and events, community events, and competitions. Students must have advanced singing and music-reading skills in order to be in Bel Canto. Membership in the group is by audition only for grades 10 - 12. \$Course Fee\$

<u>Chorale</u> is an intermediate-level mixed choir. The ensemble studies and performs challenging music in all styles and languages. Students will advance in sight-reading, vocal production and musicianship. Students will perform at school concerts and events, and may perform at community events and competitions. Membership in Chorale is open to men in grades 9 - 12 and women in grades 10 - 12. \$Course Fee\$

<u>Troubadours</u> is an intermediate-level men's choir. The ensemble is made up of all the men in the Westfield High School Choral Program. They will rehearse during Chorale sectionals as well as during bulldog block. The ensemble will sing at least one piece together per concert, and may perform at school and community events and competitions.

<u>Treble Choir</u> is an entry-level women's choir. Students will continue to improve their singing and musicianship skills while studying and performing challenging music in a variety of styles and languages. Students will learn skills that assist in all aspects of the performing arts. Classes focus on energizing the students to accomplish the musical performance. Treble Choir is open to all women in grades 9-12. \$Course Fee\$.

<u>Show Choir</u> is a performing singing group designed to incorporate all aspects of stage singing. Songs are selected from Broadway musicals, jazz, popular music, and cabarets. Students will perform choreographed dancing during the singing performances. They will perform during concerts, community events, competitions, and special performances. This is an after school, for-credit singing group. Membership in the group is by audition only and is open to women and men in grades 9-12. Auditions are held in September. \$Course Fee\$

GoldTones is a co-ed student a cappella group, and functions as a club. The ensemble will sing a variety of music in the vocal a cappella and vocal jazz styles, and may perform at concerts and school events. Membership in the group is by audition only and is open to women and men in grades 9 - 12. Auditions are held in September.

Course Fees and Mandatory Forms Due by September 12, 2014

The Course Fee and all required paperwork are due by September 12, 2014. The Course Fee for all chorus students is \$50 per student. This fee covers costs related to each student's participation in the chorus program. Examples of expenses covered by the fee include uniform accessory rental, dry-cleaning, travel to and from local performance venues, sheet music, clinicians, accompanists, choreographers, equipment, supplies, and other expenses. The chorus program is also subsidized by Music Booster and Choral Booster fundraising.

Financial assistance is available for qualifying students. Please submit a request in writing to Mrs. Pierce. **No student should feel as though they cannot participate due to an inability to pay.** Students may use fundraising profits earned to pay the Course Fee. Students may also work with Mrs. Pierce to create an individualized payment plan.

Required Course Materials

All choir students will be provided a labeled, numbered black three-ring binder in which they will maintain all course materials, handouts, assignments, and sheet music. Students must bring two sharpened pencils to each class. Sheet music is assigned to students for study and is collected periodically after performance. Students are responsible for the care of the sheet music and other materials, and for returning sheet music loaned to them. Lost music will result in a replacement fee of \$3.00 per piece of music lost. Master works, anthologies, work books, and medleys may result in a higher replacement fee.

Students are responsible for keeping their black binder in good condition. This means not drawing or writing on the binder, making sure it remains labeled, and its contents safe. Students will be assigned a specific binder as well as a binder slot in the choir room for use during the school year. All music assigned should match the binder number. Students who lose their binder or return it in poor condition will be charged a replacement fee of \$4.50.

Students are graded daily on rehearsal technique. It is very difficult for a student to participate fully if he or she does not bring the music binder, so students need to get into the habit of bringing it to class, along with a pencil for marking music, each time. Being prepared for class is an integral to being successful during class.

Charms

CharmsOffice is a web-based data storage software program used by the choral director and choral boosters to organize student information, track payments, assign uniforms, and facilitate communication. Each student is given a Charms account where parents and students can log in to view a calendar of events, volunteer, find forms and handouts, and even make audio recordings.

Uniform Information

All students need a uniform for concerts and performances. The basic elements of the uniform will be purchased and maintained by the student, with accessories maintained by the Choral Boosters. Students are able to use their uniform for the duration of their time in Chorus. When the student leaves the program they may keep their uniform, donate it to the program, or sell it to future students.

CHOIR NIGHT is September 16 at 7:00pm in the WHS Lecture Hall. This is a mandatory meeting in which important information regarding the chorus program is relayed to parents and students. **During CHOIR NIGHT**, all new students are fitted for uniforms from 6:30-8:00pm. Fittings will take place in the music hall way. All Women will be in one room, all Men in another.

For Female Students

Dress Long Formal Concert Dress: \$59.00

Shoes All girls provide their own dress shoes for performance. Below is a description of the type of shoe that is acceptable.

- ₱ Black, close-toe dress shoes, preferably with a low heel (less than 2 inches) and a back strap or heel.
- Shoes should be dressy enough to wear with an elegant looking concert gown. No boots, flip-flops, slides, platforms with chunky heels, etc.
- ₱ Black character shoes are recommended and can be purchase at the link below.

Shoes need to be closed toe and secured to the foot for safety on and off the risers.

For Male Students

Option 1: Full Tuxedo Combo (Jacket, Pants, Shirt, Bow Tie, and Cummerbund) \$95.00

Option 2: Partial Ensemble (Shirt, Pants, Tie, Cummerbund. Borrow Jacket) \$36.00

Shoes Male students must provide their own black dress shoes.

- Shoes should be dressy enough to wear with a tuxedo. No boots, loafers, sketchers, flipflops, or sandals.
- Men MUST have BLACK socks for all performance

For All Students

Jewelry

Students are permitted to wear small earrings and necklaces only. No large hoops, thick chains or cords, large pendants, etc. Nothing that jingles or makes noise. Please remove watches, bracelets, and hairties for performances.

Hair Hair needs to be secured off of the face during performances.

Uniform Information Continued

Show Choir Students

Show Choir students will receive a syllabus supplement which will explain the uniform requirements for the ensemble. Black Character shoes are a requirement for female show choir students, and may be worn with their other concert attire.

Ensemble T-Shirts

Each Ensemble will design a t-shirt at the start of each year. This shirt may be worn for various events throughout the year, and will serve as the uniform for the Spring Concert/Choral Cabaret. The Ensemble T-Shirt is paid for through the Course Fee and subsidized by the Choral Boosters

Chorus Polo Shirt

Students will be issued a chorus polo shirt as needed during the year. The shirts will be issued and returned the same day. The polo shirts will be given to you freshly cleaned.

Spirit Wear

Westfield Choir Spirit Wear can be purchased through an online store that is open at least twice a year. Items include, but are not limited to shirts, sweatshirts, jackets, hats, and socks. Spirit Wear is extra, and is not required. Parents, friends, and family members are welcome and encouraged to wear Westfield Choir Spirit Wear.

How to Care for Your Uniform

Tux Jackets, pants, and vests need to be dry cleaned. Dresses and tux shirts may be washed, but dry cleaning is recommended. Items borrowed from the Choral Department (accessories, jackets, etc) will be dry cleaned upon return.

Uniform items purchased by the student should be cared for and maintained by the student. This includes cleaning and **making any necessary alterations**.

Students should use a garment bag to protect their uniform when traveling to and from concerts and other events. Garment bags may be purchased on your own or through the Choral Department by checking the appropriate box on the Concert Attire Purchase Form.

Please hang up your uniform between performances so that it does not become excessively wrinkled. If you find that your uniform is wrinkled, please iron it on low heat. Your uniforms are tasteful and elegant; please take pride in your own appearance.

Return of Uniforms at the End of the School Year

Any items maintained by the Choral Boosters shall be returned following the last event of the school year. Items will be collected by the Choral Director and Uniform Coordinator. If a student does not return an item, he/she will be assessed the amount of the replacement cost of the item.

Annual Spring Choral Trip

The annual Spring Choir Trip location is generally announced at Choir Night. Past trips included Chicago, Orlando, New York City, Nashville, and Atlanta. These trips range in educational and performance opportunities. The cost will be based on the location selected and the excursions included. All students in good standing with the Choral Department and with Westfield High School are eligible to participate in the trip.

This year, we will be traveling to Walt Disney World in Orlando, Florida. The Band, Orchestra, Theatre, and Guitar programs will also be taking similar trips at the same time as chorus. While we are all going together to Disney, each department will have their own specific bus(s), hotel rooms, chaperones, excursions, and itineraries. Students in multiple departments must choose with which department they will travel. Efforts will be made to ensure that students get to participate in the competitions and/or workshops of both departments. An additional fee may be assessed.

District and State Events

Throughout the school year, there are several events in which students are encouraged to participate. District 11 Chorus auditions are in November. All chorus students, especially those in advanced ensembles, are strongly encouraged to audition for this prestigious music experience. District Chorus takes place in February. Juniors and seniors who participate in District Chorus are eligible to audition for All-State Chorus. Auditions are in February, and the event itself takes place in April.

Honors Choir is for distinguished senior choral students who have proven to be very strong musicians and singers. Audition is by invitation and takes place in October. The Honors Choir event is held in November. None of these events present any conflicts with other choral events as the calendar was developed with the dates in mind.. If accepted, the student may need to pay additional fees to cover participation costs.

The Choral Boosters will cover audition fees for all students interested in auditioning for District Choir, All-State Chorus, and Senior Honors Choir. Should a student fail to show up to auditions, or back out after the deadline, the student will be assessed that audition fee. Students may be asked to pay participation fees if selected for specific choirs.

Westfield High School Choral Boosters Organization

Westfield High School Choral Boosters is a non-profit organization. Its purpose is to promote and encourage community/area support of the Westfield High School Choral Program by providing volunteer and financial support. Additionally, the Choral Boosters administer a robust senior choral student scholarship program.

Membership in the Choral Booster organization does not require active participation or regular attendance at monthly meetings, though both are encouraged. Choral Booster membership forms and information can be found at www.westfieldhschoral.org.

Ad hoc committees are developed throughout the school year. These will present many opportunities for volunteerism. The majority of these opportunities are made available at meetings or via e-mail communications. To receive regular information about choral volunteer opportunities, please be sure to include a current e-mail address when completing your registration forms at the start of the school year. The Choral Boosters truly appreciate any assistance parents are willing to provide in support of the choral program! Tag Day and Other Fundraisers

The Westfield High School Choral Program requires financial resources in order to provide for the material needs of a superior program. Though Fairfax County Public Schools is generous, there is no financial allotment for uniforms, transportation, awards, scenery, accompanists, choreographers, professional musicians, and many other resources. The Choral Booster Organization works diligently to fill this financial gap through its membership and fundraising efforts. In addition, one of the highlights of the choral year is the annual Spring Competition trip, which students must pay for individually if they wish to participate. For all of these reasons, regular fundraising activities are coordinated by the Choral Boosters for the benefit of the choral program and the individual students who participate in these opportunities.

Tag Day is a Music Department fundraiser shared by the band, chorus, orchestra, and guitar programs. This year's Tag Day is Saturday, September 27, 2014. All music students at Westfield are expected to participate in this event, or contribute to the event by volunteering for one of the pre-Tag Day Activities such as Driver Meetings or Packet Stuffing. On Tag Day, students meet at the school and are assigned routes within the Westfield community. They work in teams of no less than four, and each team is supervised by a parent volunteer/driver. Teams are trained how to politely and effectively request donations from our neighbors within the community.

Each year, the music department raises approximately \$30,000. The proceeds are divided among the four music programs based on the percentage of student participation. In other words, the more choral students who participate in Tag Day, the more money Chorus will receive from the total proceeds. For this reason, all students are strongly encouraged to participate. We are also always in critical need of parent drivers for the event. This is the only fundraiser for which students are not able to earn money for their spring trips. Rather, the money goes into the general choral budget and is spent throughout the year on budgeted items such as the ones mentioned above. Without a successful Tag Day, our resources are extremely limited.

Student Fundraising Credits

The Choral Boosters keep track of student fundraising profits for all students in CHARMS. There are several fundraisers that traditionally occur throughout the school year: (pie sale, fruit and cheese sale, and cookie dough sale). Many students defray the cost of their trips significantly by participating in fundraisers. In some cases, students pay for their trips exclusively through fundraising profits. Students may also pay for uniforms, t-shirts, district chorus fees, etc., with their fundraising profits.
