

Course Descriptions

INTERMEDIATE ORCHESTRA (923815)

"Concert Orchestra"

Concert Orchestra is the current intermediate-level performance group comprised of 9th-12th graders. The level of music is from grade 3-4 which is the higher level of difficulty for high school musicians. This group focuses on improving basic skills/techniques and growing as an ensemble. An audition with the orchestra director is required for enrollment in this course.

ADVANCED ORCHESTRA (923915)

"Symphonic Orchestra"

Symphonic Orchestra is the advanced-level performance group also comprising of 9th-12th graders. Private lessons are strongly encouraged as consistent progress throughout the school year is expected for greater enhancement of playing skills. The symphony plays grade 5/6 music-often original arrangements by the composer. An audition with the orchestra director is required for enrollment in this course.

Grading

The main focus of the HHS Orchestras program is to provide the student with the opportunity to succeed. With this in mind, the following grading system will be used to evaluate the progress of the students in the orchestra program:

40% - Rehearsal Skills

You are expected to participate in class every day without exception. This means you must bring your instrument, pencil, music, and a willing attitude to class every day. You are awarded 10 points every class and 30 points every after-school rehearsal. Grades are based on participation and for following criteria below.

Each class period students will be evaluated on progress to include the following:

- Punctuality and readiness to play when class begins.
- Attention to the conductor and an attitude of cooperation
- Alertness and readiness for the downbeat, including proper posture and hand position for the instrument
- Sensitivity towards conducting gestures
- Full participation in class
- Prepared with instrument, music, and pencil every class.

A grade will be lowered for the following class/rehearsal infractions:

- No instrument- 10 points
- No music- 5 points
- No pencil and/or proper equipment- 3 points
- Talking/Chewing Gum/Class Disruption- 3 points
- Lack of attention and/or poor posture- 2 points

30% - Content Preparation

Student achievement will be evaluated through a variety of methods to include the following:

- Seating Auditions
- Playing tests
- Small ensemble performances
- Individual class performances

30% - Performance

A performance is the equivalent of a major unit test in other subjects. Performances provide the culminating activity for the many hours of class rehearsal that has occurred.

The performance portion of your grade will be based upon the following:

- Concerts at Herndon High School
- Performances at District XII Orchestra Assessment
- Senior Recital @ HUMC

If a performance is an **excused absence**, the student will have one week upon returning to school to make-up the grade. To make-up the grade, the student must perform his/her concert music for Ms. Touzinsky. This is the responsibility of the student, and the grade will become a zero **after one week.** Students who have an **excused or unexcused absence** (see attendance policy below) to the District XII Orchestra Assessment will not be permitted to attend the spring trip.

Attendance Policy

All high school students will be expected to participate in the after-school dress rehearsals, concerts, and assessment. These events provide additional instructional and performance opportunities and are considered **mandatory**.

Attendance at rehearsals, concerts, and assessment requires the student to be present for the entire duration. Students should be ready with their instrument, bow, music, and pencil by the report time. An unexcused absence from an after-school rehearsal results in a 0/30 grade for the Daily Grade category. After school rehearsals cannot be made up. Students who participate in athletics or co-curricular activities should inform Ms. Touzinsky of their schedule to provide ample time for creating a solution. "Same Day" notifications will result in an unexcused absence.

Unexcused absences to concerts or assessment cannot be made up.

Excused absences include:

- 1. Death in the family
- 2. Religious holidays or conflicts
- 3. Pre-arranged absences at the discretion of the director with at least one week notice
- 4. Unforeseen emergency situations to be reviewed at the discretion of the director

Classroom Conduct & Expectations

- 1. The classroom will remain a safe and educationally sound environment at all times. In order to achieve this, students are expected to respect themselves, staff, students, their instruments, and the rules of Herndon High School and the Orchestra program at all times. This includes a strict no cell phone/IPOD policy in the orchestra room.
- 2. Students are expected to be in their seat with their instrument/necessary materials and be ready to actively participate when Ms. Touzinsky steps onto the podium.
- 3. There will be no food, drink, or gum in the orchestra room. There will be no exceptions.
- 4. Conversations in the Orchestra room and storage room are allowed and encourage. However, once Ms. Touzinsky has begun the class and stepped on to the podium, all conversations are expected to conclude.
- 5. Students may be re-seated at the discretion of the director. Students may be given the opportunity to audition for a different seat in their respective instrument section at the discretion of the director.
- 6. All members of the orchestra are required to perform in all the dress rehearsals and concerts for the entire orchestra season. Be on time. Good rule of thumb is: *Early is on time, on time is late, and late is unacceptable!*
- 7. Communicate effectively. Conflicts and concerns can often be solved through a simple conversation. Be proactive about these issues.
- 8. Practice your instrument for a minimum of 45 minutes each day. A small amount of consistent practice time greatly outweighs the benefits of "cramming". Students will continue to develop proper technique and musical expression though consistent and diligent practice.
