

We also offer Indoor Colorguard and Drumline in the winter and I'll send out the links from their WGI World Championships performances as soon as I get them.

One of the things that I truly enjoy about TJ is that the school offers a fully comprehensive high school experience along with the additional science and tech courses. It is very rare that a school with this academic reputation would also boast one of the best fine arts departments in the country. While you enjoy taking accelerated STEM classes you also can take up to four years of band in one of the premiere programs in the US. In TJ band program there are many opportunities for you to perform and enjoy making music with your peers. The first step towards this process however is signing up for band as a freshman. The other performing groups (Marching Colonials, Indoor Drumline, Indoor Colorguard, Jazz II) are all dependant on that first step. There are certain situations later on down the road where you may take a year off from curricular band and still do the co-curricular groups, but as a freshman we do ask that you sign up for the class. I'm well aware that the instant gut reaction is that "I have to take computer science!" however that is simply one of your options and not required as a freshman. Most of my students take band as a freshman and then take computer science the summer after their freshman year. That way they are just as caught up as those who took it as a class, and they have the added benefit of enjoying a year of band as well!

When you sign up for band through registration it will place you in a holding class where I will then sort you into the correct ensemble. The choices for freshmen are:

Percussion Ensemble (all percussionists placed here, no audition required))
Symphonic Band (all wind players placed here automatically, no audition required)
Wind Ensemble (mostly upperclassmen ensemble, audition required)
Jazz Band (mostly upperclassmen ensemble, audition required)

If you wish to audition for placement into the Jazz Band or Wind Ensemble you can sign up to audition on May 10<sup>th</sup> here at TJ. If that day does not work for you simply let me know and we will work out an alternate date. You can sign up for an audition by replying to this e-mail and giving me your preference for audition time.

9am-11am – Block 1 11am-1pm- Block 2 1pm-3pm – Block 3

If you do not have any particular preference please let me know that as it will help with my scheduling. I will e-mail you back with a specific time for your audition. Auditions last 10 minutes and you can arrive as early as you would like to warm-up. The auditions are in the band room – parents are allowed to listen if they wish, but otherwise you will just play for me. I highly encourage anyone to audition, but it is not required. The audition will consist of:

### **All 12 Major Scales**

If you don't know them all that's ok, I will ask for ones you know first and then try the harder ones

### **Chromatic Scale**

At least one octave, whatever range you know is fine, more is better

### Prepared Piece

Anything you currently have prepared (solo music, band music, whatever you think showcases you best) 1-2 minutes

### **Sight Reading**

Provided by me, you will have 2 minutes to look it over and can play through it, I will leave the room for that portion and you will play when I get back. Not the same as the silent 30 seconds you get at districts.

A couple of commonly asked questions about auditions -

What are my chances of making the Wind Ensemble/Jazz Band? – depends on way too many factors to list. The short answer is that I typically only accept 2-3 freshman in the higher level groups a year, but that's not a number I hold to as a standard. I fill the groups up with the most qualified candidates for the positions. In the end all students end up being enrolled in Advanced Band, so your transcript will look the same either way (if that worries you). Have confidence that I do what is best for the program and for you as a player (but I don't put the needs of an individual ahead of the group). I am very fortunate to get many talented players to join – remember that you are auditioning for spots against upperclassmen who were just as talented as you when they first came in the program!

Which area of the audition carries the most weight? – Sight Reading and tone quality. Those are two things that have to be in place for consideration for a higher group.

I don't think I'm quite ready for one of the upper groups – should I still audition? – Absolutely! This gives me a chance to meet you and give you some feedback before the summer. I thoroughly enjoy the audition process and if the word "audition" scares you just think of it more as a getting to know you session.

When will I know the results? – Generally speaking I can tell you right away if you are in consideration for one of the higher groups. After that it takes only one to two weeks depending on some other variables.

Can I wait to see my results before I sign up for band? — The technical answer to this is yes, because I clearly can't stop you. The other answer though is please do not use the audition as a determiner of whether you are joining the program or not. All of our groups are outstanding and have received the highest marks at competitions and assessments. I know that there can be a TJ mentality that if you aren't in the highest group then you don't want to do it, and I could not disagree more. Also it really can mess up my placements for the next year if I have students signed up (and assume they will fill a position) and then they go away over the summer. Please make a decision to be a part of the TJ band family, and then trust that I will put you in the right spot and you will have a great time!

### MARCHING COLONIALS Initial Information

May 10, 2014

The 2014 Thomas Jefferson Marching Colonials season is almost underway! We will be having our interest meeting on June 3<sup>rd</sup> from 6pm-8pm in the TJ Band Room. In addition we will have three rehearsals (June 12<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> from 4pm-8pm) before the students have to commit to being in the ensemble. This means you can come out and see what the group is like before you make the full commitment. I recommend that everyone come out to at least one of those days and the interest meeting. If after that rehearsal you decide that the group is not for you then I will still be very thankful that you took the time to try it before you made your decision. Both students and parents are requested at the interest meeting. Students will meet their instrument/colorguard sections while I give out information to the parents. If you cannot make this meeting I will be happy to e-mail you the information, or you can find it at www.tjbands.org after the meeting.

TJMC is a voluntary organization that is highly recommended for any student who enjoys playing their instrument or would like to join the colorguard. The kinesthetic learning process in marching band helps even the most advanced musician achieve a new level of success on their instrument. Also the life lessons about teamwork and cooperation learned in this ensemble will serve your student for the rest of their lives. Virtually all of our freshmen who join the group stay in for all four years. Many of the students that we pick up later in high school often wish they had tried TJMC right from the beginning. Don't miss out on this great chance to be a part of one of the finest performing groups in Virginia!

One of the most important aspects of being in a competitive group where there are close to 100 starters (and no backups!) is planning. You will find our entire season-long calendar enclosed. Please check against your personal calendar so that we can minimize or totally avoid conflicts. In future years you can use this calendar as a template against a school calendar when planning vacations. We always use the first 3 weeks before school for our mandatory camp weeks.

Each and every band member and parent plays a role in our success. We depend on your enthusiastic commitment and support! Parent volunteers are needed to make it all happen, and we will gladly accept any amount of time that you can donate towards the group.

The marching band cost will be discussed at the interest meeting. We would like you to know ahead of time that if there is ever <u>any</u> issue with paying the cost, please contact me. The Band Boosters organization has funds to help families who need financial assistance. This is completely confidential and available to all members. We do not want any student to be turned away from any of the TJ band ensembles due to financial needs.

### ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF COMMITMENT

### **Policy Statement/Participation Agreement**

I understand that I am expected to honor my commitment to this ensemble by being present for all required rehearsals and performances. This includes Home Camp rehearsals (August 11-16), Orkney Springs rehearsals (August 17-22), and Post-Orkney Home Camp rehearsals (August 23, August 25-28) as well as after-school fall rehearsals through the first week of November, 2014. I will also participate in all home football game performances and scheduled competitions.

I acknowledge that there are substantial costs associated with participation in this ensemble. There are also innumerable rewards that make the experience very worthwhile.

I understand that once I make the commitment to participate in the TJ Marching Band for the season, the show is written based on my participation. This means that the show would have to be rewritten at an increased cost to the program, if I fail to complete my participation commitment.

I therefore agree to participate fully through the season. If I fail to participate after the June 26th, 2014, commitment deadline, I understand that I will forfeit my payment in full. I understand that no reimbursement will be given due to the expenses incurred by the Thomas Jefferson HSST Band Boosters, Inc. as explained earlier in this packet.

I further understand that no reimbursement can or will be made for extenuating or peripheral purchases that I have made toward my participation. All marchers should understand that both students and parents are party to this agreement, and signatures will indicate acceptance of the terms herein.

### **Uniform Agreement**

I understand that the uniform is the property of the TJHSST Marching Band and that all marchers are required to have a parent sign this agreement and the uniform receipt that is completed when the uniform is issued.

I understand that students will be issued uniform pieces listed below and that they/we are responsible for returning these same items, in undamaged condition. If any of the items are lost or damaged, we will pay the fee for replacement or repair. I agree to make no permanent alterations to any part of the uniform (do not cut fabric – hemming is ok). The marcher will immediately report any stains or damage to his/her uniform coordinator, without penalty.


### TJMC VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

### **Jazz Ensemble Course Syllabus 2014-2015**

Course Number: 924016

<u>Course Description</u>: Jazz Band explores all various styles of jazz. Students will learn how to improvise and perform in the appropriate styles. We will use jazz as we strive to discover and pursue our own passions despite societal norms and external pressures that would compromise our aspirations and dissuade us from swinging like champs.

### Course Expectations:

- Be here on time. That means having your horn out and being ready to play by the end of morning announcements.
- Learn your part at home
- Practice frequency is more important than duration
- Have good rehearsal technique. Listen to instructions, be aware of the situation.
- Be supportive of each other.
- Don't be afraid to try (improvisation)
- WRITE IN YOUR MUSIC #bringapencil

<u>Performances</u>: Check your calendar for scheduled performances. If any additional performances are added, I will give you as much notice as possible. Participation in all concerts is <u>MANDATORY</u>. This is a performance-based ensemble. Any conflicts with a concert must be brought to me as soon as you know of the conflict. For uniforms, you must purchase black socks and black shoes. Ladies must purchase flat, black closed-toed shoes. If you have to ask if you can wear it, the answer is no.

Attendance: This course follows the FCPS attendance policy.

<u>Grades</u>: If you're at a concert and play, that's an A. If you don't show up, you must record yourself, and I'll grade you based on that. You'll receive a grade every week, based on your participation / playing tests.

Grade Breakdown: 40% of your grade is from your weekly grade 60% of your grade is from your concert grade

<u>Class Materials</u>: Make sure you have everything you need to make your instrument work.

Everyone will do at least two improvisational solos throughout the year. Jazz band is a place where you will make mistakes. Be kind to others, and don't be afraid to get out there! In order to facilitate better salsa playing, we will partake in Chipotle® once every other month when possible.

#### Notes -

The Jazz Band will occasionally be asked to perform at events that come up throughout the year – I rely on the students to check their calendars when we are asked to perform and get back with me quickly to see whether or not we can accept the gig.

There are additional 8<sup>th</sup> Period rehearsals that students are expected to attend that are on the intranet and posted outside my office well in advance.

I recognize that weekend concerts are not ideal – renovation has put this limitation on us and we simply have to do the best we can. Required events can only be excused for illness or other unavoidable emergencies. Please plan ahead and come out to enjoy the wonderful music these students make.

Calendars for TJMC, Indoor Drumline and Indoor Colorguard will be posted on the website and distributed separately.

Students will not wear concert attire for the 8<sup>th</sup> period performances.

Communication is the key! If there is ever any issue please communicate with me as soon as possible to see if there are any possible solutions.

The communication system that we use is called Charms (<a href="www.charmsoffice.com">www.charmsoffice.com</a>). If you are not yet registered in Charms we will have instructions about this going out to your students in the very near future. Everyone will be in the system by mid-October. It requires you to log on and register once I hand out the instructions, so please ask your students about it in the coming weeks.

### Curricular Band 2014 -15: Concert Attire

Curricular band includes the Jazz Band, Symphonic Band, and Symphonic Wind Ensemble (SWE). Due to financial practices in the county our band fee needs to be split. Previously a single fee amount had gone towards paying for uniforms and other band needs, such as, sectional coaches and guest artists we bring in to work with all the groups. We can no longer use the fee money on those coaches and guest artists. With that in mind we would like to have a \$30 TJHSST Uniform Fee, and also ask for a \$60 donation to Band Boosters. Our ability to spend the funds drastically changed with new policies set in place. **You can not combine all amounts into one check**. Attach the stub below with your checks. The fee will go towards the curricular uniforms and garment bag, and the donation will be put towards the sectional coaches and guest artists. Having professionals come in to work with the students is invaluable, and we are not willing to lose that extra educational benefit. Your curricular band check is in addition to any fees your child may have paid to the TJ Marching Colonials.

This year for concerts, all of the **girls in SWE and the Symphonic Band** will wear long black dresses and pearl necklaces. The \$30 TJHSST Uniform Fee covers the rental of these garments and accessories. Girls must provide their own hose (if they wear them) and black dress shoes.

Boys in SWE and Symphonic Bands will wear black tuxedo jackets and pants, bowties, cummerbunds. The jacket and pants are by the \$30 TJHSST Uniform Fee. Boys provide their own black socks and black dress shoes. Each boy must also provide his own white, long-sleeved tuxedo shirt with a pleated front, wing-tipped collar, and Cummerbund & Tie. This shirt may be the shirt the boy purchased for a previous year in TJ curricular band, make sure it still fits! Otherwise, the boy will need to purchase a new shirt through the Band Boosters. If you have a son who needs a new shirt (\$15) and/or Cummerbund & Bowtie (\$10), please add \$15 and \$10, respectively, to your total TJHSST Uniform Fee.

Both girls and boys in the Jazz Band will wear black shirts and black tuxedo pants rented by TJHSST, which are covered by the \$30 TJHSST Uniform Fee. Jazz Band members provide their own black socks and black dress shoes.

All uniform components rented through the Band Boosters will be turned in after the final concert in the spring.
