Welcome, New Marchers (and Parents!), to the Lake Braddock Marching Band

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## Introduction:

You got lucky. You're part of one of the biggest freshman classes the Lake Braddock Marching Band has ever had. This fall, some 70 freshmen will join with about 140 returning band members to create an extraordinary and huge performance machine. By the time you are a senior, with three years of marching experience behind you, our band will be unstoppable. When we say we are glad to welcome you to the Marching Band, that's not an exaggeration. This is a remarkable and exciting time!

## Important Dates:

We hold mandatory Marching Pre-Season Rehearsals in late August. Once school starts, we have after-school rehearsals from 3:00 to 4:30 on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays until November 5. We perform a halftime show at all home football games and encourage our marchers to play in pep band at some away games. We are participating in several competitions this year, all on Saturdays. And we have a "tag day" fundraiser to support the program. Please note these dates:

## What To Expect:

Marching Pre-Season Rehearsals is a lot of work... and a lot of fun. If you're nervous about it, remember that no one expects you to know what you're doing yet, and there are about 70 other new marchers just like you. We're used to freshman marchers and we will show you what to do. (And you thought you already knew how to walk...!)

Mr. Mike Luley is the Band Director, and he's assisted by Mr. Pat Smith. The band will have two Drum Majors who lead the band; they are Kaela Avino and Aaron Lee. You'll have one or more section leaders in your instrument group; these are (usually) seniors with lots of experience who will help you as you learn.

The Lake Braddock Marching Band has a tradition of success. We've gotten a "superior" rating from VBODA, the assessment organization, for thirty-three years straight - and we get it because we insist on a strong focus on the music. We play music that is complex, so be prepared to be challenged - and to be proud.

You'll practice with sheet music during Marching Pre-Season Rehearsals, but you should work to memorize your music as soon as you can. It helps in learning your marching drill and in becoming a precise marcher. If you'd like to review and study your music in advance - a very smart idea! - you can download your parts from the Charms system (more information below).

Once you think you've gotten your music memorized, you "pass off" by playing your part to your section leaders. Then they'll give you the band t-shirt for the 2014-2015 year. Wear it with pride!

## Marching Pre-Season Rehearsals Tips from the Marchers:

- Put sunscreen on before you even leave the house, and bring it with you to reapply during the day. We're not outside all the time - but we're outside enough to make a sunburn a real nuisance.
- Bring plenty of water. (Fruit drinks and sodas tend to attract bees, so please leave them at home.) The night before you march, freeze two bottles of water and put two in the fridge; by
the time you've finished your cold water the next day, the frozen bottles will have thawed. Nothing better on an August day!
- Learn your music as quickly as you can. Focusing on precise marching is a lot easier if you know what you're supposed to be playing.
- Consider a hair cut before Marching Pre-Season Rehearsals. You'll be cooler, and for performances, all hair must be hidden under your hat anyway.
- Don't worry if you don't know anybody else in the band. By the end of the first day, you'll have over 200 new friends and band mates!


## For Parents

Your kids are about to be part of a "band family" - you can be part of that family, too. We rely on parent volunteers who generously give their time to help things run smoothly behind the scenes. The more you get involved, the more you'll enjoy the band program. Be a member of the pit crew (to move percussion instruments into place before each performance), be a chaperone for competitions, take part in special events - there are lots of ways to get involved, and lots of other parents who are hoping you'll join in to help. More information will be available at the Band pot-luck picnic on August 27.

## Band Fees and Donations; the Charms System

We charge $\$ 90$ per student in band fees, and are asking each family to make a voluntary donation of $\$ 25$ to cover the cost of hiring professional musicians from the area's superb military bands to work with our kids during Marching Pre-Season Rehearsals.

Fees and donations can be made by check. There is a purple lock box in the band room; have your child deposit your payment there or mail it to the school, in care of Mr. Luley. The mailing address is Lake Braddock Secondary School, 9200 Burke Lake Road, Burke VA 22015

# Lake Braddock Secondary School <br> Marching Band and Color Guard Program <br> Finance Information and Policies 

For School Year 2014-2015

The Bruin Band Boosters have entered into a Memorandum of Agreement with Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS) to collect fees for required FCPS course materials and FCPS sponsored optional activities.

FCPS will not charge students a fee for any mandatory aspect of the band except for musical instruments and course material fees which are permitted by Virginia Department of Education (VDOE) regulations. Schools or booster organizations cannot require a student to pay fees for course materials in excess of the amount approved by the School Board in Notice 5922, Revenue, Tuition, and Fees - Student Fees.

As a result of the agreement with FCPS, we have restructured the types and manner of payments collected. The new fee structure will be effective for the 2014-2015 school year.

## Fee Structure

The new structure includes required Course Materials Fees and FCPS sponsored optional Activity Fees. Course materials fees cover consumable materials associated with a course and are a required element of that course. FCPS sponsored optional activity fees are charged in connection with a particular activity and cover some or all of the actual costs of that activity. Participation in the particular activity is optional but if a student decides to participate in the activity, payment of the activity fee is required. Any fees collected that exceed actual cost of materials or activities must be refunded to the parent.

Lake Braddock Marching Band Course Materials Fee (\$90, due by June 13th): This fee is similar to required fees paid for certain, other FCPS classes. It covers course materials related to the course. Examples of the materials eligible to be covered by this fee include: uniform purchases, the drill book, music/choreography for the show, band t-shirt, instrument accessories, equipment repairs, and food during instructional activities.

## Musical Instrument Rental Fee (determined each school year by county and will be due in September):

 This required fee only applies to students who play school-owned instruments and covers maintenance costs of those school-owned instruments.
## Payment Policies

Payments may be made via credit card, cash, or check as described below.

- Credit Card payments are made through Charms. After making your payment, please log back into Charms to ensure that your payment appears within your student account.
- Payments made by check should be placed in the lockbox within the band room. If paying by check, please make the check payable as instructed for the particular payment and write the name of the student and the name of the fee being paid in the memo line of the check. Please note that a fee will be assessed for any returned checks. Such fee will be the actual amount charged by the bank related to the returned check, not to exceed \$50.
- If paying by cash, please put the money in an envelope and write the name of the student and the name of the fee being paid (i.e. Tom Smith, Spring trip fee) and take the envelope to the front office of the school and give it to the Lake Braddock SS staff responsible for collecting such cash payments. A receipt will be given to you acknowledging the cash payment. NO CASH PAYMENTS SHOULD BE DEPOSITED INTO THE LOCKBOX IN THE BAND ROOM.


## Refunds

Typically fees paid are non-refundable once commitments and purchases have been made. These refund policies will be communicated separately as they relate to individual activities.

Students and parents may login to their student account in CHARMS at any time to view fees and balances due.

# LAKE BRADDOCK BANDS 2014-2015 SYLLABUS 

GRADING POLICY AND GUIDELINES

Instrumental music has the dual goal of improving the skills of the individual musician while also presenting fine public performances. This is an ensemble, participation course. Individual skills improve through private practice, daily instruction, and commitment to the performance objectives of the full ensemble.

It is the goal of the instructor to help every student earn an $\underline{A}$ for every grading period. The student must spend the personal practice time necessary to properly prepare all assigned music. The student must be attentive and actively involved in daily rehearsals. The student must properly execute regularly scheduled minimum competency playing exams. The student must show definite improvement and progression in musical understanding and performance. Extra help is available to all students through the instructor, older players and private instruction

Grades in the Lake Braddock Band program will be determined based on a weighted point grading scale and FCPS percentages to determine letter grades. Students will begin each quarter with zero points and earn points in each category as the quarter progresses. Each student will be given a weekly rehearsal skills grade based off the attached rubric. Each category will be worth a percentage of the final quarter grade. The areas in which students will earn points are as follows:

## Weekly Rehearsal Skills - 25\%

- Preparation, Retention, Execution, and Progression.
- Proper and serviceable equipment- pencils, music, instrument, reeds, mouthpieces, valve oil, drill book, shoes, etc.
- Engagement- Posture, Attentiveness


## Participation-25\%

- After school rehearsals


## Performance - 50\%

- Performances
- Concert Etiquette- Attire, Punctuality, Demeanor, Equipment, Uniform


## DISTRICT ASSESSMENT

District 11 Band Assessment occurs every year during the first weekend in March. This is Band's equivalent to the VA SOL. Our bands will play for a panel of nationally-recognized adjudicators and will be given ratings based on their performance. Exact performance times and dates are to be determined, and students should be available for performance on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. Please consult the attached calendar and pay careful attention to the date for your Assessment performance. This event is absolutely required!

## ATTENDANCE POLICY

The Lake Braddock Secondary School Attendance policy will be in effect for absences to all daily classes. Attendance at ALL after school rehearsals and performances of the Lake Braddock Bands are required.

## STUDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO NOTIFY THE BAND DIRECTOR IN WRITING FOR ALL

 ABSENCES.APPROPRIATE DOCUMENTATION - NOTE/EMAIL FROM PARENT/GUARDIAN OR DOCTOR - IS DUE THE FIRST SCHOOL DAY FOLLOWING ANY ABSENCE THAT IS NOT PRE-APPROVED.

## EXCUSED ABSENCES:

- Illness
- Family Emergency
- Pre-Approved conflict - submitted in writing and approved by director (8 weeks in advance for Performance or 2 weeks in advance for rehearsal)
*Leniency will NOT be considered for "day-of" requests.
*Leniency will most likely not be considered for "week-of" requests.
* The key to working out compromises in your schedule is EARLY COMMUNICATION!


## UNEXCUSED ABSENCES:

In band, we are constantly using formative assessments throughout every rehearsal. Each performance is a summative assessment that is unique and cannot be duplicated. All students are integral members of each ensemble. The group performance is rehearsed and prepared intricately. Performances are greatly affected by the absence of even one student. For this reason, excused performance absences are seldom granted.

## The following deductions will be made from a student's overall quarterly grade for unexcused absences:

- Marching Band Rehearsal: 5 Points
- After-School Concert Band Rehearsal: 10 Points (One letter grade)
- Performance (Concerts, Football Games, Competitions, Assessments, Etc.): 20 Points (Two Letter Grades)

## SPORTS POLICY

Mr. Luley and Mr. Smith will try to be as flexible as possible while still honoring the ensemble's integrity. Efforts can be made to arrange compromises. This happens with appropriate and early COMMUNICATION with Mr. Luley, Mr. Smith, and Coaches.

## REHEARSAL CONDUCT

Rehearsals are not for students to learn their parts, but to learn how their part fits together with the rest of the ensemble.

Poor rehearsal skills affect student achievement and will be reflected in their weekly rehearsal grade. Rehearsal skills expectations:

1. Be Respectful.
2. Be Attentive and actively engaged though-out rehearsal.
3. Be Prepared Mentally: prepared, retain, and progress consistently (THIS MEANS PRACTICE!!!)
4. Be Prepared Physically: have all proper and serviceable equipment

## ENSEMBLE/CHAIR PLACEMENT

Chair and Ensemble placement are determined by many factors including, but not limited to the following: player ability, strengths/weaknesses, the needs of the ensemble, work ethic, ensemble skills, etc. It is important for performers and parents to realize that an ensemble is a continually evolving organization. A performer does not have an assumed position/chair through-out a school year. Students should commit to self-progression and be aware that others are doing the same. For this reason the Lake Braddock Bands have procedures for "challenging." "Challenges" are a procedure whereby students can audition to move in to a different "chair ranking" after the formal auditions have taken place. The Challenge must be pre-arranged with the director with at least one week notice to prepare. Challenges will not take place two weeks before a scheduled performance.
*It is the director's discretion to remove or relocate a student from a performance, chair placement, or assigned ensemble if the performance or rehearsal expectations are not being met.
