Organization & Objectives

Organization: The Choral Music Department is comprised of five skill-based ensembles. Students advance to the next level choir by demonstrating a higher understanding of the Chorus Program of Studies objectives and by successfully completing an audition. The five choirs are:

- Bel Canto Beginning Women's Choir, 9th grade only (non-auditioned)
- Men's Choir Beginning/Intermediate Men's Choir, grades 9-12 (non-auditioned)
- Women's Vocal Ensemble Intermediate Women's Choir, grades 10-12 (non-auditioned)

 Select Women's Ensemble Advanced Women's Choir, grades 10-12 (auditioned choir)
- Lake Braddock Singers Advanced Mixed Choir, 10-12 (auditioned choir)

Objectives: The main objective of the Choral Department is to make music. Singing in an ensemble is a unique human experience where all individuals work together to achieve a common goal. Each person and his/her contributions are vital to the success of the group as a whole. Specific objectives of the choral program include the following:

- 1. To be aware of vocal health issues and to learn proper vocal technique. This is essential in the development of each individual's singing voice and style and consequently the development of the choir. Chorus rehearsals will focus on relaxation and posture, breath control, resonance, placement, diction, and the fundamentals of good tone production.
- 2. **To improve musicianship.** Learning the fundamentals of music theory will enhance each individual's ability to sight-read and understand the tonality and form of the pieces being performed. Music theory will be taught through listening exercises, warm-ups, sight-reading, journaling, and through the pieces themselves.

- 3. **To recognize many different musical styles and their relationship to history**. A variety of music will be covered ranging from the Renaissance, Baroque, Classical, Romantic, and Contemporary periods with emphasis on the appropriate performance practice for each style of music.
- 4. **To experience all aspects of performance**. Students will be given opportunities to perform in both small and large ensembles. Students wishing to experience solo singing will have the added benefit of experiencing the audition process. Performing in public concerts and attending various musical performances is required of all students in the choral program.
- 5. To accept responsibility as a member of the ensemble. Each individual will work diligently, along with other students toward a common goal. Individuality within the group is necessary and welcomed, but respect toward the director, other members of the group, and the music is everyone's responsibility and must always be maintained. Students will uphold the Lake Braddock core values of Responsibility, Respect, Commitment, Integrity and Compassion and the regulations of the Honor code.

- Attends and participates fully in assigned sectional rehearsals. Sectional forms should be turned in on time in order to receive full credit. (*This applies only to Advanced Ensembles*)

Extra Credit (applied to weekly participation/Rehearsal Skills)

- 5 points of extra credit are earned for attending a choral, orchestral, or band concert in which you are not a performer. This also includes musical theatre productions. *Students working on behalf of Tri-M are not eligible for extra credit.* You must turn in a written review within one week of the performance and (please include the program).
- 5 points of extra credit are earned for performing in a concert or musical theatre production for which you are not receiving a grade. Please turn in the program within one week of the performance date.
- 3 points of extra credit are earned for attending a rock concert, Lake Braddock *Unplugged*, or *The Main Thing*. Please turn in the program with a one paragraph description of the highlights of the performance
- □ 1 point of extra credit can be earned for wearing chorus attire to school.

Peer to Peer help

- The tutor receives 5 points per half hour of help offered to a student or group of students in any HS choral ensemble.
- The student in need of tutoring will receive 5 points for initiating the appointment for help. (Log time and attendance in to Bruin Block notebook under "peer helping" to receive credit).

Teacher help

The student in need of tutoring will receive 5 points for initiating the appointment for help.

Second Chance Assessments

Any student who wishes to retake a test (written or sight reading), may do so as long as he/she has studied and/or sought help to study/practice. The repeat test must be taken within the week of the first test.

Sectional Rehearsals/Personal Practice Logs

- Electronic practice logs must be turned in every Monday for work completed the **prior** week. This Google doc can be found on Blackboard.
- **Students in auditioned choirs** must participate in a one hour sectional each week.
 - Section leaders should schedule the sectional with section members in mind.
- Students in non-auditioned choirs must rehearse at least one half hour per week. This practice time can be done individually or in groups.
- Students who are absent from sectionals will be expected to turn in a personal practice form. Forms are available on Blackboard. Only 2 Personal Practice forms will be accepted per quarter, so plan ahead please!
- Students who are absent on a sectional due date will be expected to turn in forms upon their return.

 Late forms will lose 10 points per day. Forms will not be accepted if they are more than one week late.

Attendance Policy

Chorus provides a unique learning opportunity for students. The required curriculum involves time, both in and out of school, and focuses on working as a group. Please take time to read this important information regarding required attendance. Lake Braddock families have very busy schedules. It is extremely important to understand this information and plan ahead by adding chorus events to your family calendar, in order to minimize conflicts. Please understand that due to the nature of the class, not all conflicts will be excused. Chorus is a curricular subject like Math or Science; not extracurricular like team sports or dance classes.

REHEARSALS

Students may only be excused from required after school or Bruin Block rehearsals by talking to Ms. DeMarco in advance and *must be validated* by a parent or teacher email. Absences will be excused for school related conflicts or major family events. Unexcused absences will result in no credit. **Ms. DeMarco should be contacted** *at least* a week in advance if a conflict of events exists.

Dress Rehearsals are mandatory, and will not be excused except in extreme circumstances. Students who do not attend the dress rehearsal may not be permitted to perform in the concert, at the discretion of Ms. DeMarco.

CONCERTS

Students will *not* be excused from required performances except in cases of extreme illness or Parents should contact Ms. DeMarco at 703-426-1297 or mldemarco@fcps.edu if an emergency arises. Excused students will be given the opportunity to make up the points by completing an assignment.. Unexcused students will receive no credit.

Emergency absences not reconciled within 2 days of the concert will stand as unexcused.

CLASS

Students with unexcused absences during the school day will not be given the opportunity to make up credit for missed assignments, rehearsals, or performances. Ms. DeMarco has the right to deny a student the right to perform in a concert due to excessive absences, regardless of whether they are excused. Please do not schedule appointments during chorus class. It is vital that ensemble members are present in class.

CONFLICTS

Your schedule is your responsibility. However, conflicts do arise after school with team sports and other activities. If you plan ahead and communicate with both teacher and coach, rehearsals can be split in order to accommodate both rehearsal and practices etc. Do not rely on your teammates, sponsors, or coaches to let Ms. DeMarco know about conflicts. PLEASE NOTE: DRESS REHEARSALS AND CONCERTS WILL NOT BE EXCUSED FOR SPORTS PRACTICE, OTHER REHEARSALS OR PERFORMANCES.

Supplies



Each choral student should have the following supplies in class everyday:

- - O You may not share this binder with another class!
- Notebook Paper
- Music
- A water bottle

In addition, each student should bring in a box of tissues in the beginning of the year to share with the class.

Chorus students are expected to pay a minimum fee of \$30. This includes the 2014-15 chorus T-shirt, and classroom materials. Additional attire fees are required for dress/accessory purchase and tuxedo rental. Please refer to the attire forms sent to you prior to the opening of school for details.

What to wear ...

We have two types of concert attire, formal and informal. The informal concert attire is the chorus t-shirt which should be worn with jeans or black pants as directed by Ms.DeMarco.

The formal concert attire **for men** is:

A black tuxedo, white tuxedo shirt, cummerbund, bow tie, black socks and black shoes.

The formal concert attire **for women** is a long black concert dress, black panty-hose/knee highs, black dress shoes, and pearls.

- ☐ Girls should wear black undergarments with the formal attire.
- □ Large jewelry and watches are prohibited. Rings and small stud earrings are permitted.
- ☐ Hair must be worn off the face for all performances.
- Women's shoes should be flats or 1" heels with closed toes and heels. Shoes should not have excessive decoration.

For Men and Women

- □ Dresses and pants need to be professionally hemmed to the correct length for the shoes worn.
- ☐ The director will determine the concert attire for each performance.







Behavior and Etiquette Guidelines

All guidelines are based on the Core Values of: Respect, Responsibility, Honesty, Integrity and Compassion

- Students will, at all times, conduct themselves in a way that well represents the Choral Program and upholds the Core Values and Honor Code of Lake Braddock Secondary School.
- Students, at all times, will demonstrate proper respect to the director, guest clinicians, substitutes, chorus officers, chaperones, section leaders and other students.
- Students will follow all instructions given by the person or persons in charge.
- Students will cause no disturbance while rehearsals are in session.
- Students will not talk while the director or acting director is on the podium.
- Students will not eat, drink (with the exception of water) or chew gum during class, rehearsals or performances.

Trips Away From School

- Students are expected to abide by FCPS regulations at all times and to follow the same basic courtesies as mentioned above.
- ☐ Each student will be directly responsible to the Director and/or chaperones on the bus, host school or venue and hotel.
- ☐ There will be no excessive noise or rude behavior at any time.
- ☐ Performance attire must be worn as required.
- ☐ Unless specified for the entire group, no private transportation will be allowed going to an event. All students must ride the bus. A student may return from an event with his/her parents only if the Director is notified beforehand by an email from the parent.
- ☐ Proper forms for medication (prescription and over the counter) are required for all students.

Is the Spring Trip a Requirement?

Chorus is an ensemble class, and each singer is important to the success of our choir during performances. Much like a sports team, every person's effort makes a difference, and we never want to have a performance that isn't the best representation of the work we have done and are capable of doing. The Fairfax County Music Program of studies specifies that choirs should be adjudicated outside of the school setting. As a result, it is hoped that all chorus students will participate in the spring trip. Financial concerns can be addressed by participating in fundraisers and by applying for scholarships from LBVMB. Scholarships will not be awarded to students who do not participate in *at least* one fundraising opportunity.

2015 Spring Trip to Chicago-April 8-12th.

Commitment forms for the trip will be due with a \$75 deposit by October 1^{st.} (Checks payable to LBSS)

We will need 21 chaperones on this trip. If you would like to chaperone, please indicate this on the commitment form; no deposit will be required of chaperones.



Collection of fees:

There are four types of fees:

- 1. Mandatory materials (uniforms, tees and class materials)
 - Checks for these fees should be made out to: LBSS
- 2. Spring Trip fees
 - ☐ Checks for these fees should be made out to LBSS
- 3. Non-mandatory monies such as booster membership, spirit wear and fundraisers
 - Checks for these payments should be made to LBVMB
- 4. District Choir fees.
 - ☐ For auditioned choir students, this audition is mandatory and the fee was collected with your other fees at Bruin Blast.
 - If a student in a non-auditioned choir chooses to audition, a fee of \$15 dollars will be collected in mid-October.
 - The check should be made out to LBSS

Directions for collecting money

- When writing a check, please put your student's name in the <u>memo line</u> with the reason for payment. (example, Darla Smith/spirit wear).
- Have your student turn in payments directly to the locked purple box in P133.
- ☐ Checks are preferable, but if you are making a payment in cash, please see Ms. DeMarco before depositing money into the purple box; a receipt will be given.

Raising Funds for Chorus Events

Why do we raise money for chorus?

General Fund – This money is used in three ways:

- 1. to **lower trip** costs
- 2. to award scholarships to graduating seniors
- 3. to help support general operating costs and supplies for the choral department.

These general fundraisers are:

- Yankee Candles September (and continuing on line until January 1st)
- Fun Pasta September (and continuing on line until January 1st)
- See's candies November/December
- Poinsettias November/December
- Got Music Day: singing in a neighborhood shopping center (TBA)
- Carwashes (TBA)
- No frills fundraisers/partnership with local food eateries (TBA)
- Dessert on Broadway (replacing family fun fest/chili fest (February)

Individual Student Credits – These credits are applied to individual accounts. The only fundraiser that goes specifically into a student's account is SCRIP. This purchase with a rebate is the most direct way to assist your student and lowering the amount of his/her trip cost. The individual accounts can be used by the student to defer the cost of the Spring Trip and other chorus events. Individual account credits carry over from year to year during the student's time in High School Chorus. When a student graduates, the credits in their account are applied to the general fund or passed to a younger sibling.

Applying your Personal Account Credits

- 2) The amount you would like transferred
- 3) The activity for which you are paying (spirit wear or spring trip)

This year hours of service will be logged using x2VOL. A meeting will be held on September17th, for all students interested in participating and running for office in Tri-M during Bruin Block. - ✓ Maintain a 3.0 overall GPA and a 3.5 or higher in music.
- □ Complete the Service Hours requirements:
 - Each member must complete three service hours per nine-week grading period. Check the Tri-M information on x2VOL or the Tri-M bulletin board for eligible activities
- Attend all Tri-M Meetings.
 - o ALL MEETINGS ARE MANDATORY!
- ☐ Tri-M inductions will be held at bruin Block on Wednesday, September 24th.
