#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Emphasis is on mastering the skills necessary for the performance of Grade IV band literature. Students will participate in Virginia Band and Orchestra Directors Association (VBODA) sponsored events such as District X Concert Band Assessment. Concerts of traditional and contemporary band works at the Grade III- IV level will be prepared and performed. Small ensemble and solo work as well as music theory and history will be components of this course. <u>Students are expected to practice an average of 30 minutes per day.</u> This is a performance-based class and involves participation in concerts and other performances and rehearsals outside of class time.

PREREQUISITE: Instrumental music in middle school.

#### MARCHING BAND

Marching Band is not a component of being in Concert Band. However, from time to time students will play marching band music with others in the class.

#### MATERIALS AND UNIFORMS

- · Specific attire is required for performance.
- Instrument, music, appropriate mouthpiece and accessories (reeds, valve oil, etc.) and pencil are required daily. A daily Performance grade of "0" will be given if students do not bring *all* required materials to class.

#### FEES

- FCPS requires an instrument rental fee for all school and county owned instruments
- All students in a performing ensemble are required to pay a consumables fee (information on band website).
- Fees for District Band auditions and Solo and Ensemble will be announced prior to registration.

#### SECURITY AND INSTRUMENT STORAGE

- Most students have a locker in Springbank. The instrument storage room to be used for band instruments and band supplies.
- All instrument cases are to be clearly marked with the student's name. Any student found tampering with another student's
  instrument or equipment will be referred to their assistant principal for disciplinary action.
- Don't leave anything out in the room that you would like to keep. Unfortunately, thefts have occurred in the music hallway. Be smart as to where you put your personal belongings during class, marching band, concerts, etc.

#### STUDENT CONDUCT

- All students in the West Potomac music program are expected to treat others with respect at all times. A cooperative spirit is not only necessary for the success of the class, but will make your experience more enjoyable.
- Students are expected to follow the Fairfax County Public Schools Code of Conduct and all West Potomac High School rules.

- Other required performances may be added. There will be a minimum of three weeks' notice.
- Dress Rehearsals count in the Performance portion of the grade.
- Playing and/or written tests may be given periodically to evaluate each student's progress.
- An All-District Band audition is required.
- Grade percentages for each quarter (9 weeks) will be derived from the following: \*may be adjusted as necessary at discretion of the director

Daily Performance (40%)
Playing Quizzes (15%)
Performance in Concerts/Games and Afternoon/Evening Rehearsals and Practices (45%)


- I. Dress Rehearsals- Dress Rehearsals are defined as one or more rehearsals leading up to a concert. The Dress Rehearsal will be clearly noted as a dress or final rehearsal on a curricular syllabus. Directors reserve the right to call extra rehearsals leading up to the concert. Every effort will be made on the Director's part to notify the students in a timely manner. The student must make every effort to attend these rehearsals.
  - a. Excused Absences- Personal Illness, Family Death. Student must present a note from a qualified healthcare professional confirming absence and/or illness. The deadline to let your instructor know about any excused absence from a concert or dress rehearsal is 1 month. By giving notice, students are not automatically excused. At the discretion of your director, approval of the absence may be given. Emergencies will be handled on a case-by-case basis; students will be subject to the same criteria for a missed concert or dress rehearsal.
  - b. Unexcused- All other. Excessive school absences during a concert/performance cycle can forfeit your privilege to perform in a concert but does not excuse you from attending the concert.
- II. Grading for a Missed Dress Rehearsal- When you miss a Dress Rehearsal; you miss the following items; Rehearsal technique, performance technique, and ensemble performance techniques. You will still be expected to complete the assigned work, or its equivalent, to demonstrate your mastery of the skill or knowledge that the original assignment was intended to measure. Directors also reserve the right to involve administrators if necessary, and consequences may extend beyond the classroom.
  - a. Make Up Assignments:

They will also be required to complete a written assignment related to the concert, or at the discretion of the director. The assignment will be graded and counted as a replacement for the missed concert. Students will not receive full credit. They have the opportunity to earn 90% of the credit that was allowed by the original event.







Students will participate in Virginia Band and Orchestra Directors Association (VBODA) sponsored events such as District X Concert Band Assessment. Percussion ensemble literature will be prepared and performed. Students may be asked to perform with the concert bands. Solo work as well as music theory and history will be components of this course. <u>Students are expected to practice an average of 30 minutes per day.</u> This is a performance-based class and involves participation in concerts and other performances and rehearsals outside of class time.

PREREQUISITE: Percussion in middle school

#### MATERIALS AND UNIFORMS

- Specific attire is required for performance.
- Instrument, music, appropriate mouthpiece and accessories (reeds, valve oil, etc.) and pencil are required daily. A daily Performance grade of "0" will be given if students do not bring all required materials to class.

#### FEES

- There is a concert band fee of \$20 to defray the cost and material upkeep of the uniforms and other incidentals.
- FCPS requires an instrument rental fee for all school and county owned instruments checks made out to <u>WPHS</u> 10/1/2013

#### SECURITY AND INSTRUMENT STORAGE

- Most band students are assigned a locker in Springbank. Some instruments will not fit in those lockers. The instrument storage room to be used for band instruments and band supplies only.



#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Emphasis is on mastering the skills necessary for the performance of Grade IV band literature. Students will participate in Virginia Band and Orchestra Directors Association (VBODA) sponsored events such as District X Concert Band Assessment. Concerts of traditional and contemporary band works at the Grade IV level will be prepared and performed. Small ensemble and solo work as well as music theory and history will be components of this course. <u>Students are expected to practice an average of 30 minutes per day.</u> This is a performance-based class and involves participation in concerts and other performances and rehearsals outside of class time.

PREREQUISITE: Director's approval and audition is required for entry into the ensemble.

#### **MARCHING BAND**

Marching Band is a component of being in Symphonic Band. This is a performance-based grade and involves participation in competitions, fundraisers and football games outside of school time.

#### **MATERIALS AND UNIFORMS**

- Specific attire is required for performance.
- Instrument, music, appropriate mouthpiece and accessories (reeds, valve oil, etc.) and pencil are required daily. A daily Performance grade of "0" will be given if students do not bring all required materials to class.

#### FEES

- FCPS requires an instrument rental fee for all school and county owned instruments
- All students in a performing ensemble are required to pay a consumables fee (information on band website).
- Fees for District Band auditions and Solo and Ensemble will be announced prior to registration.

#### SECURITY AND INSTRUMENT STORAGE

- Most students have a locker in Springbank. The instrument storage room to be used for band instruments and band supplies.
- All instrument cases are to be clearly marked with the student's name. Any student found tampering with another student's instrument or equipment will be referred to their assistant principal for disciplinary action.
- Don't leave anything out in the room that you would like to keep. Unfortunately, thefts have occurred in the music hallway. Be smart as to where you put your personal belongings during class, marching band, concerts, etc.

#### STUDENT CONDUCT

Every effort will be made on the Director's part to notify the students in a timely manner. The student must make every effort to attend these rehearsals.

- a. Excused Absences- Personal Illness, Family Death. Student must present a note from a qualified healthcare professional confirming absence and/or illness. The deadline to let your instructor know about any excused absence from a concert or dress rehearsal is 1 month. By giving notice, students are not automatically excused. At the discretion of your director, approval of the absence may be given. Emergencies will be handled on a case-by-case basis; students will be subject to the same criteria for a missed concert or dress rehearsal.
- b. Unexcused- All other. Excessive school absences during a concert/performance cycle can forfeit your privilege to perform in a concert but does not excuse you from attending the concert.

Percussion ensemble literature will be prepared and performed. Students may be asked to perform with the concert bands. Solo work as well as music theory and history will be components of this course. <u>Students are expected to practice an average of 30 minutes per day.</u> This is a performance-based class and involves participation in concerts and other performances and rehearsals outside of class time.

PREREQUISITE: Permission of the instructor

#### MATERIALS AND UNIFORMS

- Specific attire is required for performance.
- Instrument, music, appropriate mouthpiece and accessories (reeds, valve oil, etc.) and pencil are required daily. A daily Performance grade of "0" will be given if students do not bring all required materials to class.

#### **FEES**

- There is a concert band fee of \$20 to defray the cost and material upkeep of the uniforms and other incidentals.






