# WHY STUDY INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC?

Music education is unique and necessary for all students. Music is a basic way of knowing oneself and one's world. Music offers meaningful, cognitive experience unavailable to us in any other form. All meanings cannot be adequately expressed by words. If they could, then music would not exist. Music education develops this unique intelligence and is necessary for all students if their essential humanness is to be realized.

The creative process of music is most important. The composer has certain ideas and life experiences that influence a piece of music. The performer brings other ideas and life experiences that influence the interpretation of and reaction to the piece. The listener brings still other ideas and life experiences to the process that affects their reaction to the piece. Music is something different and meaningful to each of us and captures emotions and ideas too complex for words.

Playing an instrument is a powerful tool for brain stimulation involving such areas as aesthetic beauty, creative expression, communications, cultural science, history, math, physics, and science.

Goal setting, self-discipline, self-evaluation, stress management, and time management are other skills that are learned in the process of music making. These are invaluable to the successful person, no matter what profession they pursue.

Playing an instrument can become a career or a meaningful hobby for life. Colleges, communities, and religious organizations welcome capable string players, and may even offer scholarships. Great opportunities for education, profit, and travel are also often made possible by playing an instrument.

# **PROGRAM DESCRIPTION**

The LHS orchestra program is designed to develop, in a sequential pattern, ensemble skills to parallel Standards One – Ten as listed in the Fairfax County Public School's (FCPS) <u>Program of Studies.</u>

The program offers advanced technical instruction with emphasis on musical styles and a variety of music literature. String orchestra is emphasized as a working means to develop depth of tone, style, compatibility of individual abilities, technical adjustment, and musical maturity. The study of music theory and ear training is emphasized as an extension of the previous levels of instruction. Performance activities as educational experiences are an important consideration at the secondary level. These activities include string orchestra, full orchestra, small ensembles, solos, festivals, community performances, and concert attendance. String orchestra classes are considered an integral part of the academic educational structure, and appropriate course credits are awarded towards graduation.

# **MATERIALS**

- Accessories (rosin, shoulder rest, rock stop, etc.)
- Music in folder (textbook equivalent)
- Method/study books
- Pencils
- Orchestra Uniform
- Orchestra T-Shirt (The cost of this shirt is included in the student's orchestra fee)
- Tuner
- 1 spiral-bound 8.5 x 11 in notebook

\* Students who use school-owned instruments must complete the Fairfax County Public School "Music Instrument Contract." Fees are \$92.00 for the year; \$46.00 if the instrument is shared with another student (checks payable to Robert E. Lee High School). All contracts and rental fees are due no later than <a href="Wednesday">Wednesday</a>, September 10, 2014. \*\*\*Those who play cello or bass MUST rent an instrument through the school. Students will not be allowed to use school-owned instruments until contracts have been completed.

# **ORCHESTRA FEES**

Orchestra fees cover the cost of awards, some supplies, an orchestra t-shirt, and other consumable materials as indicated by FCPS notice 5922. Please make checks payable to **Robert E. Lee High School** for \$35.00, and return check with <u>your student's name on it</u> by **Friday, Sept 26**<sup>th</sup>.

NOTE: Instrument Rental Fee and Class Fee must be paid on separate checks and/or cash payments.

Students eligible for the federal Free and Reduced-Price Meals program must turn in the FCPS Consent
To Share Information for Benefits for Other Programs form in order to have fees reduced or waived.

# SCHOOL INSTRUMENT INFORMATION

There are a limited number of school-owned violins and violas for rent and these will be offered to students as needed. Priority will be given to students who do not already own an instrument.

If a school owned instrument is damaged due to normal wear and tear, then the repairs will be handled by the county's instrumental repair service, ATEC. If the damage is the result of a willful act against the instrument, then the student will be responsible for the repair costs.

# **INSTRUMENT STORAGE AND MAINTENANCE**

Instruments should not be stored in a student's vehicle for long periods. Cold, dryness, heat and humidity must be regulated for your instrument's health. For security reasons, students will not be permitted to retrieve his or her instrument from their car during the school day. Store your instrument at school in the storage area or lockers provided. Please make sure that you lock your lockers after you put your instrument away.

Regularly check your bridge to make sure that it is standing straight and is not warped. Regularly check the humidity of your instrument and use a "Dampit" as needed. Monitor the temperature and humidity of the area in your home where you store your instrument. While at home, always store your instrument in its case and make sure it is latched.

You should schedule a maintenance check for your instrument and have your bow rehaired, if needed, at a reputable violin shop.

#### **GRADING POLICY**

According to the policy guidelines set forth in the Fairfax County Public Schools Administrative Handbook for Music, grades will be "based upon observation of individual students in the group and a grade balance between effort and achievement." (page X-2) **Students will be evaluated in the following manner:** 

50% Rehearsal Participation 25% Tests/Assignments (both playing and written) 25% Performances

**A.** Rehearsal Participation - The participation grade will consist of daily performance in class and at all after-school rehearsals. Students will receive ten points for every class period that occurs. Failure to have the proper materials or to make significant progress on assigned music from one rehearsal to the next will result in a deduction of rehearsal points.

In order to receive full credit for each rehearsal, students must do the following on a daily basis:

- 1. Read the board or rehearsal sign upon entering the rehearsal area
- 2. Set up with the required materials (see materials list above)
- 3. Store cases, backpacks, and other materials not needed for rehearsal in orchestra lockers or assigned locations in the orchestra room.
- 4. Put music in the rehearsal order written on the board
- 5. Be in seats ready to begin at the start of class or rehearsal
- 6. Actively participate in all facets of the rehearsal (i.e.: following all instructions, playing, singing, listening, counting, writing)
- 7. Demonstrate proper posture and instrument position while playing or singing
- 8. Have no gum, food, drink (except for water), or electronic devices during rehearsal
- 9. Have paper and pencil (NO PEN)
- 10. Have completed homework assignments (practiced music or completed written work)
- 11. Follow classroom electronics policy electronics devices are off and stowed, unless specifically requested to be used by the teacher. Electronics are never permitted while in uniform.

There will be mandatory after-school rehearsals scheduled throughout the school year. Students will be notified of them at least one week in advanced through classroom communication and Blackboard. Please see section titled **Attendance and Make-Up Work Policy** for information regarding the absence from a mandatory after-school rehearsal.

# B. Tests

- 1. <u>Playing</u>: Students will perform at least one playing exam during each grading period. Exams will be performed live during class. Make-ups will be available on a case-by-case basis. Frequent assignments will be posted on FCPS 24-7 Learning.
- **2.** <u>Written</u>: Information to be covered will include music theory, music history and literature, musical terms, and definitions. Types of assignments will include work sheets, reports, intonation charts, and harmonic and rhythmic dictation. Frequent assignments will be posted on FCPS 24-7 Learning.

\*\*\* Any assignments (written or not) for points must follow the Lee HS code of Academic Integrity. Written assignments will most often be in research paper form, with bibliography and correct citing required.

<u>Cheating and Plagiarism</u>: Plagiarism and/or cheating on any assignment will result in an automatic zero; this includes sharing of materials with other students – both parties will lose all credit for the assignment in question. Additionally, all formal papers, essays, etc. will be submitted to turnitin.com or credit will not be given. For major assessments, all parties involved will be given the opportunity to re-do the assignment for a maximum of 60% credit; this opportunity will only be given after a conference with the teacher and contact with parents

# C. Performances

**CONCERT ATTENDANCE** is of utmost importance. Quarterly concerts are considered the final exam of each term. The auditioned groups may have more than one concert requirement per quarter. Students who are absent from a concert performance must do a **performance videotape of their part as a solo to be graded by the VMEA Assessment rubric provided in the video format as required by the teacher.** All make-up assignments are due within two weeks or the end of the quarter, whichever comes first. Students who do not complete the make-up work will receive the grade of an F.

A student whose family is planning a trip during a scheduled concert must submit a pre-arranged absence form to the school **at least two weeks prior to the trip.** The student will prepare a videotaped performance of their solo part to be graded by the Assessment Grading Rubric due the last day they attend school before they leave.

# **Performing Arts Department Absence Form**

If you know in advance that you will be absent from a concert performance and/or required rehearsal, then complete and submit the **Performing Arts Department Absence Form** to Ms. Gladys Altekruse prior to the event.

**AFTER** the absence, it is your responsibility to do all of the following:

- 1. Complete the Performing Arts Department Absence Form if the absence was not prearranged.
- 2. Complete assigned make-up work if the absence was excused according to the terms of the **Performing Arts Department Absence Form**.

A student who is absent because of an emergency or sudden illness can submit the form within one day of returning to school.

# Assessment

District 10 Orchestra Assessment is the SOL (Standard of Learning) Test for Music Classes. It is the culminating evaluation of the entire year's intense study. **STUDENTS MAY NOT MISS THE ASSESSMENT PERFORMANCE FOR ANY REASON.** The dates of Assessment are determined at the state level each year. Specific performance times for each orchestra are assigned a few weeks prior to the Assessment. Therefore it is imperative that students and families <u>reserve the entire Assessment block of time listed</u> on the calendar.

This year all co-curricular activities will be subject to the FCPS participation policy. As stated by the policy, "students must be in school the entire day to be eligible to participate in any student activities scheduled on that that day. Exceptions may be made with prior approval of the principal or his designee."

# Student's grades will be evaluated on the following scale:

- A Student demonstrates superior work in daily rehearsals; shows evidence of regular, thorough home practice; always works to the best of ability in all daily rehearsals; is able to work effectively with teacher and classmates (can function as a leader if needed); has correct music, equipment, and materials at all times; is attentive always.
- **B** Student demonstrates above average work in daily rehearsals; shows evidence of regular home practice; works to the best of ability in most daily rehearsals; is able to work effectively with teacher and classmates (can work independently); has correct music, equipment, and materials regularly; is attentive.
- C Student demonstrates average work in daily rehearsals; shows evidence of adequate, but irregular, home practice; works below ability during many daily rehearsals; experiences a little difficulty working with teacher or classmates; is without proper music, equipment, and materials occasionally; is inattentive occasionally.
- **D** Student demonstrates below average work in daily rehearsals; shows little evidence of home practice; works below ability in most daily rehearsals; experiences much difficulty working with teacher or classmates (needs supervision often); is without proper music, equipment, and materials frequently; is inattentive frequently.

F Student demonstrates poor work in daily rehearsals; shows no evidence of home practice; works below ability (shows little or no effort); is unable to work with teacher or classmates (is unable to work independently and constantly requires supervision); is without proper music, equipment, and materials regularly; is inattentive regularly.

# **EXTRA CREDIT POLICY**

An important aspect of growing as a performer and listener is to experience performances from the audience perspective. Students may earn **5 extra credit points** for attending a concert in which they are not performing. These performances may include, but are not limited to: Lee H.S. chorus and band concerts, church or community concerts, studio recitals, and events throughout the Northern Virginia, Maryland, and DC area. Concerts must be those that reinforce literature and concepts covered in the student's own Lee H.S. ensemble. Students need to check with their director in advance to make sure the concert they wish to attend will be acceptable. After the performance students need to turn in a concert program signed by a parent/guardian.

#### **SPRING TRIP**

The spring trip is an exciting and important activity for orchestra members. It gives the orchestra the opportunity to grow closer and rewards students for their hard work and dedication. This year we will be going to Orlando. More information will be communicated at a later date.

# SOME ENCOURAGEMENTS

All students are encouraged to:

- Study with a private teacher who specializes in teaching your instrument. Ms. Gladys will have lists of private teachers.
- Participate in a youth symphony orchestra. (American Youth Philharmonic, Levine School Orchestra, Mclean Youth Orchestra, Youth Orchestras of Fairfax, and Youth Orchestras of Prince William, etc.)
- Audition for the Junior District Orchestra (9<sup>th</sup> grade only) or Senior District Orchestra (grades 9-12). Remember 9<sup>th</sup> graders: if you choose to audition for the Senior District Orchestra in October and are not accepted, then you are **not** eligible to audition for the Junior District Orchestra. You must make a choice from the start!
- Perform in the District Solo and Ensemble Festival. Ms. Gladys will provide information about this event later during the school year.

# **UNIFORMS**

**FOR ALL PERFORMANCES**, students must wear the complete uniform. Inspection will be conducted before all performances. Failure to pass inspection will be reflected in the student's grade.

# **BOYS ONLY \*\***

**PANTS:** black tuxedo pants with satin stripe

**SHIRT:** white tuxedo with wing collar and pleated front (Shirt must remain tucked in at all

times!) Wear ONLY solid white T-shirt or undershirt underneath the tuxedo shirt.

**JACKET:** black tuxedo jacket with notched collar. Jacket may be unbuttoned when students sit

down. (Jacket must remain completely on at all times unless otherwise specified by the

director!)

**CUMMERBUND:** black with pleats facing up **BOW TIE:** black tie, completely hooked

**SOCKS:** black socks (students need to provide their own socks!)

**SHOES: POLISHED** black dress shoes

# **GIRLS ONLY \*\***

DRESS: black concert dress (ordered through Lee H.S.), hemmed 3 inches from the floor with

shoes on

**STOCKINGS:** black hosiery (stockings or tights)

**SHOES:** black low-heel dress shoes (no boots, clogs, sandals, flip-flops, etc.)

# **ALL STUDENTS**

**HAIR:** keep it neat and "formal." Any hair accessories used must be neutral color, black, gold,

or silver.

**JEWELRY:** keep it simple and in good taste. Only pearls, or simple gold or silver chains may be

worn. Large pendants, shell, or rope necklaces are not appropriate. Everything you wear should be neutral and match the formality of the black concert dress. You will be

asked to remove anything "overdone."

MAKE-UP: simple and in good taste. No face paint or hair paint (i.e.: Lancer logo on face, blue hair,

etc.)

**CELL PHONES:** at no time may a student possess a cell phone while in uniform!

<sup>\*\*</sup> Students MUST change clothes in the appropriate dressing room or rest room. Changing clothes in the orchestra room or orchestra locker room is prohibited and subject to disciplinary action.

# **Uniforms**

Dear Students and Parents/Guardians,

As stated in the Course Outline and Syllabus sent home the first day of class, uniforms are required for all students enrolled in Orchestra.

This year all students needing an orchestra uniform will be purchasing them through the school.

<u>FOR ALL PERFORMANCES</u>, students must wear the complete uniform. Inspection will be conducted before all performances. Failure to pass inspection will be reflected in the student's grade as appearance is part of the performance.

# For Ladies:

DRESS: black concert dress, hemmed 3 inches from the floor with shoes on

**STOCKINGS:** black hosiery (stockings or tights)

**SHOES:** black low heel dress flats (no boots, clogs, sandals, flip-flops, etc.)

The cost of the Orchestra Dress is \$67.00.

All checks are made payable to Robert E. Lee High School.

\* Students eligible for the federal Free and Reduced-Price Meals program must turn in the FCPS Consent To Share Information for Benefits for Other Programs form in order to have fees waived.

Ladies have already been measured with the help of parent volunteers. Once the dress is purchased, it becomes the property of the student. It is the students' responsibility to have their dresses hemmed 3 inches from the floor with their shoes on before the first orchestra concert, Tuesday Oct. 28. Tell your tailor to leave a large enough hem for future alterations when you grow taller. **Payment for the dresses is due by Friday, Oct. 24.**

Dear Orchestra Parents/Guardians and Students:

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The LHS orchestra program is designed to develop, in a sequential pattern, ensemble skills to parallel Standards One – Ten as listed in the Fairfax County Public School's (FCPS) <u>Program of Studies.</u>

The program offers advanced technical instruction with emphasis on musical styles and a variety of music literature. String orchestra is emphasized as a working means to develop depth of tone, style, compatibility of individual abilities, technical adjustment, and musical maturity. The study of music theory and ear training is emphasized as an extension of the previous levels of instruction. Performance activities as educational experiences are an important consideration at the secondary level. These activities include string orchestra, full orchestra, small ensembles, solos, festivals, community performances, and concert attendance. String orchestra classes are considered an integral part of the academic educational structure, and appropriate course credits are awarded towards graduation.

#### **MATERIALS**

- Instrument\*
- Accessories (rosin, shoulder rest, rock stop, etc.)
- Music in folder (textbook equivalent)
- Method/study books
- Pencils
- Orchestra Uniform
- Orchestra T-Shirt (The cost of this shirt is included in the student's orchestra fee)
- Tuner
- 1 spiral-bound 8.5 x 11 in notebook

\* Students who use school-owned instruments must complete the Fairfax County Public School "Music Instrument Contract." Fees are \$92.00 for the year; \$46.00 if the instrument is shared with another student (checks payable to Robert E. Lee High School). All contracts and rental fees are due no later than <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>September 10</u>, <u>2014</u>. \*\*\*Those who play cello or bass MUST rent an instrument through the school. Students will not be allowed to use school-owned instruments until contracts have been completed.

#### **ORCHESTRA FEES**

Orchestra fees cover the cost of awards, some supplies, an orchestra t-shirt, and other consumable materials as indicated by FCPS notice 5922. Please make checks payable to **Robert E. Lee High School** for \$35.00, and return check with <u>your student's name on it</u> by **Friday, Sept 26**<sup>th</sup>.

NOTE: Instrument Rental Fee and Class Fee must be paid on separate checks and/or cash payments. Students eligible for the federal Free and Reduced-Price Meals program must turn in the FCPS Consent To Share Information for Benefits for Other Programs form in order to have fees reduced or waived.

# SCHOOL INSTRUMENT INFORMATION

There are a limited number of school-owned violins and violas for rent and these will be offered to students as needed. Priority will be given to students who do not already own an instrument.

If a school owned instrument is damaged due to normal wear and tear, then the repairs will be handled by the county's instrumental repair service, ATEC. If the damage is the result of a willful act against the instrument, then the student will be responsible for the repair costs.

# **INSTRUMENT STORAGE AND MAINTENANCE**

Instruments should not be stored in a student's vehicle for long periods. Cold, dryness, heat and humidity must be regulated for your instrument's health. For security reasons, students will not be permitted to retrieve his or her instrument from their car during the school day. Store your instrument at school in the storage area or lockers provided. Please make sure that you lock your lockers after you put your instrument away.

Regularly check your bridge to make sure that it is standing straight and is not warped. Regularly check the humidity of your instrument and use a "Dampit" as needed. Monitor the

temperature and humidity of the area in your home where you store your instrument. While at home, always store your instrument in its case and make sure it is latched.

You should schedule a maintenance check for your instrument and have your bow rehaired, if needed, at a reputable violin shop.

# **GRADING POLICY**

According to the policy guidelines set forth in the Fairfax County Public Schools Administrative Handbook for Music, grades will be "based upon observation of individual students in the group and a grade balance between effort and achievement." (page X-2) **Students will be evaluated in the following manner:** 

50% Rehearsal Participation
25% Tests/Assignments/Semester Project (both playing and written)
25% Performances

**A.** Rehearsal Participation - The participation grade will consist of daily performance in class and at all after-school rehearsals. Students will receive ten points for every class period that occurs. Failure to have the proper materials or to make significant progress on assigned music from one rehearsal to the next will result in a deduction of rehearsal points.

In order to receive full credit for each rehearsal, students must do the following on a daily basis:

- 1. Read the board or rehearsal sign upon entering the rehearsal area
- 2. Set up with the required materials (see materials list above)
- 3. Store cases, backpacks, and other materials not needed for rehearsal in orchestra lockers or assigned locations in the orchestra room.
- 4. Put music in the rehearsal order written on the board
- 5. Be in seats ready to begin at the start of class or rehearsal
- 6. Actively participate in all facets of the rehearsal (i.e.: following all instructions, playing, singing, listening, counting, writing)
- 7. Demonstrate proper posture and instrument position while playing or singing
- 8. Have no gum, food, drink (except for water), or electronic devices during rehearsal
- 9. Have paper and pencil (NO PEN)
- 10. Have completed homework assignments (practiced music or completed written work)
- 11. Follow classroom electronics policy electronics devices are off and stowed, unless specifically requested to be used by the teacher. Electronics are never permitted while in uniform.

There will be mandatory after-school rehearsals scheduled throughout the school year. Students will be notified of them at least one week in advanced through classroom communication and Blackboard. Please see section titled **Attendance and Make-Up Work Policy** for information regarding the absence from a mandatory after-school rehearsal.

# B. Tests

- 1. <u>Playing</u>: Students will perform at least one playing exam during each grading period. Exams will be performed live during class. Make-ups will be available on a case-by-case basis. Frequent assignments will be posted on FCPS 24-7 Learning.
- **2.** <u>Written</u>: Information to be covered will include music theory, music history and literature, musical terms, and definitions. Types of assignments will include work sheets, reports, intonation charts, and harmonic and rhythmic dictation. Frequent assignments will be posted on FCPS 24-7 Learning.
- **3.** <u>Semester Project</u>: Students in Chamber Orchestra will be required to complete a semester project. More details, including project choices, will be communicated at a later date.

\*\*\* Any assignments (written or not) for points must follow the Lee HS code of Academic Integrity. Written assignments will most often be in research paper form, with bibliography and correct citing required.

<u>Cheating and Plagiarism</u>: Plagiarism and/or cheating on any assignment will result in an automatic zero; this includes sharing of materials with other students – both parties will lose all credit for the assignment in question. Additionally, all formal papers, essays, etc. will be submitted to turnitin.com or credit will not be given. For major assessments, all parties involved will be given the opportunity to re-do the assignment for a maximum of 60% credit; this opportunity will only be given after a conference with the teacher and contact with parents

# C. Performances

**CONCERT ATTENDANCE** is of utmost importance. Quarterly concerts are considered the final exam of each term. The auditioned groups may have more than one concert requirement per quarter. Students who are absent from a concert performance must do a **performance videotape of their part as a solo to be graded by the VMEA Assessment rubric provided in the video format as required by the teacher.** All make-up assignments are due within two weeks or the end of the quarter, whichever comes first. Students who do not complete the make-up work will receive the grade of an F.

A student whose family is planning a trip during a scheduled concert must submit a pre-arranged absence form to the school **at least two weeks prior to the trip.** The student will prepare a videotaped performance of their solo part to be graded by the Assessment Grading Rubric due the last day they attend school before they leave.

# **Performing Arts Department Absence Form**

If you know in advance that you will be absent from a concert performance and/or required rehearsal, then complete and submit the **Performing Arts Department Absence Form** to Ms. Gladys prior to the event.

**AFTER** the absence, it is your responsibility to do all of the following:

1. Complete the **Performing Arts Department Absence Form** if the absence was not prearranged.

2. Complete assigned make-up work if the absence was excused according to the terms of the **Performing Arts Department Absence Form**.

A student who is absent because of an emergency or sudden illness can submit the form within one day of returning to school.

# **Assessment**

District 10 Orchestra Assessment is the SOL (Standard of Learning) Test for Music Classes. It is the culminating evaluation of the entire year's intense study. **STUDENTS MAY NOT MISS THE ASSESSMENT PERFORMANCE FOR ANY REASON.** The dates of Assessment are determined at the state level each year. Specific performance times for each orchestra are assigned a few weeks prior to the Assessment. Therefore it is imperative that students and families <u>reserve the entire Assessment block of time listed</u> on the calendar.

This year all co-curricular activities will be subject to the FCPS participation policy. As stated by the policy, "students must be in school the entire day to be eligible to participate in any student activities scheduled on that that day. Exceptions may be made with prior approval of the principal or his designee."

Student's grades will be evaluated on the following scale:

- A Student demonstrates superior work in daily rehearsals; shows evidence of regular, thorough home practice; always works to the best of ability in all daily rehearsals; is able to work effectively with teacher and classmates (can function as a leader if needed); has correct music, equipment, and materials at all times; is attentive always.
- **B** Student demonstrates above average work in daily rehearsals; shows evidence of regular home practice; works to the best of ability in most daily rehearsals; is able to work effectively with teacher and classmates (can work independently); has correct music, equipment, and materials regularly; is attentive.
- C Student demonstrates average work in daily rehearsals; shows evidence of adequate, but irregular, home practice; works below ability during many daily rehearsals; experiences a little difficulty working with teacher or classmates; is without proper music, equipment, and materials occasionally; is inattentive occasionally.
- **D** Student demonstrates below average work in daily rehearsals; shows little evidence of home

practice; works below ability in most daily rehearsals; experiences much difficulty working with teacher or classmates (needs supervision often); is without proper music, equipment, and materials frequently; is inattentive frequently.

F Student demonstrates poor work in daily rehearsals; shows no evidence of home practice; works below ability (shows little or no effort); is unable to work with teacher or classmates (is unable to work independently and constantly requires supervision); is without proper music, equipment, and materials regularly; is inattentive regularly.

# **EXTRA CREDIT POLICY**

An important aspect of growing as a performer and listener is to experience performances from the audience perspective. Students may earn **5 extra credit points** for attending a concert in which they are not performing. These performances may include, but are not limited to: Lee H.S. chorus and band concerts, church or community concerts, studio recitals, and events throughout the Northern Virginia, Maryland, and DC area. Concerts must be those that reinforce literature and concepts covered in the student's own Lee H.S. ensemble. Students need to check with their director in advance to make sure the concert they wish to attend will be acceptable. After the performance students need to turn in a concert program signed by a parent/guardian.

# **SPRING TRIP**

The spring trip is an exciting and important activity for orchestra members. It gives the orchestra the opportunity to grow closer and rewards students for their hard work and dedication. This year we will be going to Orlando. More information will be communicated at a later date.

# SOME ENCOURAGEMENTS

All students are encouraged to:

- Study with a private teacher who specializes in teaching your instrument. Ms. Gladys will have lists of private teachers.
- Participate in a youth symphony orchestra. (American Youth Philharmonic, Levine School Orchestra, Mclean Youth Orchestra, Youth Orchestras of Fairfax, and Youth Orchestras of Prince William, etc.)
- Audition for the Junior District Orchestra (9<sup>th</sup> grade only) or Senior District Orchestra (grades 9-12). Remember 9<sup>th</sup> graders: if you choose to audition for the Senior District Orchestra in October and are not accepted, then you are **not** eligible to audition for the Junior District Orchestra. You must make a choice from the start!
- Perform in the District Solo and Ensemble Festival. Ms. Gladys will provide information about this event later during the school year.

# **UNIFORMS**

**FOR ALL PERFORMANCES**, students must wear the complete uniform. Inspection will be conducted before all performances. Failure to pass inspection will be reflected in the student's grade.

# **BOYS ONLY \*\***

**PANTS:** black tuxedo pants with satin stripe

**SHIRT:** white tuxedo with wing collar and pleated front (Shirt must remain tucked in at all

times!) Wear ONLY solid white T-shirt or undershirt underneath the tuxedo shirt.

**JACKET:** black tuxedo jacket with notched collar. Jacket may be unbuttoned when students sit

down. (Jacket must remain completely on at all times unless otherwise specified by the

director!)

**CUMMERBUND:** black with pleats facing up **BOW TIE:** black tie, completely hooked

**SOCKS:** black socks (students need to provide their own socks!)

**SHOES: POLISHED** black dress shoes

# **GIRLS ONLY \*\***

DRESS: black concert dress (ordered through Lee H.S.), hemmed 3 inches from the floor with

shoes on

**STOCKINGS:** black hosiery (stockings or tights)

**SHOES:** black low-heel dress shoes (no boots, clogs, sandals, flip-flops, etc.)

# **ALL STUDENTS**

**HAIR:** keep it neat and "formal." Any hair accessories used must be neutral color, black, gold,

or silver.

**JEWELRY:** keep it simple and in good taste. Only pearls, or simple gold or silver chains may be

worn. Large pendants, shell, or rope necklaces are not appropriate. Everything you wear should be neutral and match the formality of the black concert dress. You will be

asked to remove anything "overdone."

MAKE-UP: simple and in good taste. No face paint or hair paint (i.e.: Lancer logo on face, blue hair,

etc.)

**CELL PHONES:** at no time may a student possess a cell phone while in uniform!

<sup>\*\*</sup> Students MUST change clothes in the appropriate dressing room or rest room. Changing clothes in the orchestra room or orchestra locker room is prohibited and subject to disciplinary action.
