If you are in Concert Band, you are <u>very strongly</u> encouraged to be a part of the marching band. Many members of Concert Band do march, and we hope you will too!!

August rehearsals are **required** for **all** members of the marching band. This two-week period is absolutely critical. If you have a problem or conflict with any time during that period, please do everything you can to get out of it! Doctor's appointments, for example, should be rescheduled so they do not conflict.

Early August rehearsals for percussion and guard before Band Camp are required for those students only (and student leaders). **Starting August 12, the entire marching band is to be at all events listed**. For those events where times are not currently listed, they will be announced as soon as possible. Check the website <u>www.raiderband.org</u> for calendar updates!

# **IMPORTANT NOTES ON THE CALENDAR!!**

Please CAREFULLY review EVERY DATE on the calendar on the back of this sheet. Marching band commitments end with the Bell Game on November 8th. Let me know if you cannot make ANY of these dates, only AFTER you have tried VERY HARD to get out of whatever conflict you have! All marching band dates are included, EXCEPT for any extra summer percussion and guard meetings/rehearsals. We will be in touch!

# MARCHING BAND FAQ

**How do I get in to Marching Band?** If you are a member of advanced band (Wind Ensemble, or Symphonic Band) you are required by FCPS to be in the Marching Band. If you are in Concert Band, you may choose to be in the Marching Band (most students do). If you choose not to enroll in a band class at all, you may still try out for the color guard, but you may not play an instrument with the marching band. Completion of the forms in this packet is all that is required to sign up. (Percussionists have placement auditions in June)

What if I play an instrument that does not march? In some cases, one instrument can be substituted for another. In other cases, you may be asked to try a new instrument. Don't worry, if you want to march, an instrument will be found!

Welcome to the J.E.B. Stuart High School Band Program! There are many exciting events planned for this school year, please take time to read through this syllabus and visit <u>www.raiderband.org</u> for the latest information.

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course focuses on the development of skills and knowledge in the area of wind and percussion instrumental music; skills learned previously are strengthened and expanded. Students will perform music at appropriate grade levels set forth in the FCPS program of studies.

## **TOPIC OVERVIEW**

Quarter 1 - 22%: Fundamentals of sound and tone production during warm-up and basic exercises Perform the circle of fifths (memorized) in a comfortable range

Analyze, count and perform intermediate level rhythms in various time signatures

- Quarter 2 22%: Further development of tone production during warm-up, basic exercises and sheet music Circle of 5ths/major scales - perform a two octave range with characteristic tone Analyze, count and perform intermediate and advanced level rhythms with subdivision Group performance assessment in December
- Quarter 3 22%: Development of consistent characteristic sound/tone production with an emphasis on pitch Circle of fifths and the minor scale – continuation of expanded range, 2 and 3 octaves Analyze, count, perform and sight-read advanced level rhythms with subdivision Group performance assessment in February/State performance assessment in March
- Quarter 4 22%: Consistent and mature tone production throughout total instrument range with good pitch Major scales from memory (two octaves) timed Analyze and perform advanced level rhythms with strong subdivision and musical awareness
  - Group performance assessment in May/June

Final Exam – 12%: Graduation performance and written music theory exam

## MATERIALS

Instrument in performance condition, pencils, reeds, neck straps, ligatures, sticks/mallets, valve oil and cork grease, book/sheet music

Supports Available: (Students are expected to use these supports to enhance academic achievement)

- After school enrichment, public/group lessons with director
- Private lessons (list available in band room)
- Internet (youtube, itunes)

## **GRADING DESIGN**

The course grade is made up of four quarter grades and a Final Exam. Students learn at different speeds, therefore this course does have a system in place for students to possibly improve their grades. All details are included below:

#### Grading Criteria:

- 40% Summative Assessment – Concerts/performances
- 30% Formative Assessment – Mostly assessed during after school rehearsals/tutoring sessions
- 30% **Rehearsal Preparation and Classroom Engagement**

#### Assessment:

- Summative •
  - Concerts and performance assessments (1-3 performances a guarter)
  - Quarterly comprehensive skills assessments (1-5 tests a quarter) 0
- Formative •
  - Performance assessments designed to evaluate student/group progress and develop proficiency
  - Self-assessments/peer feedback of progress towards mastering concert music and other musical concepts
- Rehearsal preparation and classroom engagement
  - Warm-up exercises to strengthen established skills and prepare for the daily lesson objective
  - Preparation for class students are expected to practice outside of class time 20 minutes a day

Re-takes for quarterly skills assessments may be taken after school up to two weeks after the assessment. The highest grade a student may earn on a re-take given within one week of the original assessment is 90%; within two weeks is 75%.

- Students are expected to be on-time to all rehearsals/performances ٠
- Students are expected to maintain instrument in concert performance condition •
- Students are expected to adhere to the policy set forth in the FCPS co-curricular statement •
- No food, or flavored drink in class, only water is allowed
