#### Conflict Notification

Like band and orchestra, chorus is a performance-based class. Scheduled performances are assessments that measure each student's progress. Unlike traditional academic classes, performance classes consist of daily rehearsals in which group concepts are built in over time. While it is possible for a student to "catch up" if a rehearsal session must be missed, consistent absences from class create a situation where work cannot necessarily be made up. If a student misses more than 30% of the class sessions leading up to a given performance, the director may remove the student from that performance at his discretion.

Chorus at the high school level is considered advanced-level. These students have a lot of music to learn and the music may be at a higher level of difficulty than the students have previously encountered. Practice outside of class time is a requirement of the choral program. The purpose of outside practice is to ensure that the music for the concert is accurately learned so that group rehearsals can proceed smoothly. Students will have their vocal parts recorded on their cell phones. Students should practice regularly at home in order to be as prepared for class "rehearsals" as possible.

Prior to each performance, the director schedules "dress rehearsals" outside of class time. The purpose of a dress rehearsal is to put all performers together at the same time and work out any logistical or performing problems that may arise in a combined performance. Dress rehearsals directly affect the outcome of the performance. Because we measure student progress in live performances, it is extremely complicated to make up an absence from a dress rehearsal or performance. Because of this, these absences are rarely excused.

A conflict notification form is posted in Charms. If you feel that your child must miss a scheduled rehearsal or performance, please print this form, fill it out and turn it in to Mr. Frels at least two weeks prior to the rehearsal or performance. Forms received after this time will not be considered for grading purposes. If no form is received, it is assumed that the parents and student understand the time requirements.

## DRESS WEAR AND CARE

Remember that you are renting the dress. Please care for it appropriately. You are expected to return the dress at the end of the year in the same condition in which you got it.

#### HEMMING

- Before the first concert in December, you are responsible for hemming your dresses.
- Put in no more than a 3-inch hem.
- Dresses should not drag the ground nor be so short that the entire shoe shows.
- Use matching dark blue thread, not staples or tape.
- Check the integrity of the hem before each concert. (This is for your safety. A-loose-hem could cause a fall.)

#### **PERFORMANCES**

- Dresses should be cleaned and touched-up with an iron, as necessary.
- Girls must wear closed-toe black dress shoes with heels no higher than 2 inches. (They will be walking on stage, up stairs and risers. High heels could cause falls.)
- Girls must wear black stockings or knee-highs.
- If you have a wardrobe problem, you must arrive 15 minutes prior to call time to take care it. The wardrobe room will close at call time.

#### DRESS CLEANING GUIDELINES

- Dresses can be machine washed delicate cycle Cold wash/Cold rinse (best if washed alone).
- Tumble dry on delicate.
- Hang dress up immediately to help prevent wrinkles.
- Light iron if necessary.

## TUXEDO WEAR AND CARE

- Men's wardrobe consists of a jacket, pants, shirt, vest, and tie.
- Please machine wash and dry shirt before each concert.
- Hang shirt immediately after removing it from dryer to avoid the need for ironing.
- Men wear black, closed-toe shoes and black socks.

HONORING PRESIDENT WARREN The 2014 White G. HARDING House Christmas ornament honors the administration of Warren G. Harding, who served as the 29th president of the US from 1921 to 1923. As a young boy, Harding dreamed of being a locomotive engineer—a wish that was to come true for 51 minutes when as president, he took over the controls on the Alaskan railroad during the "Voyage of Understanding," his famous speaking and sightseeing tour. The Presidential Special, the train that carried President Harding west at the outset of his ambitious voyage and that would tragically carry his casket back east following his sudden death, just two months later, is the inspiration for our 2014 ornament

Decorated with gold tones and enamel finishes, the 33rd annual White House Christmas Ornament is the first ornament to be comprised of two pieces, which can be hung as two separate ornaments or linked together.
