Dear Supervisor Hudgins,

Mr. Gibson and Dr. Dale asked me to respond on their behalf to your e-mail below requesting information on the new elementary report cards.

The beginning of the process to redesign the elementary progress report began over three years ago with the creation of a project team charged with revising the 30-year old progress report. This team is comprised of content specialists, principals, and representatives from other departments. Teachers at field test schools were added as consultants once the schools were identified. Before creating any draft versions, the project team held several focus groups for principals, teachers, and parents to determine features for the new version. A draft version was created, then *beta* tested at two elementary schools for one quarter. After receiving feedback from parents and teachers at these two schools, the draft version was revised before field testing it in ten elementary schools. During the past two years as the field testing has progressed, numerous focus groups for principals, teachers, and parents have been conducted to seek input on the draft. These focus groups have been conducted at various phases of our field test. The draft of the elementary progress report has been revised numerous times during the field testing based on input from these groups. The field testing is still in progress for this school year. Implementation of the new standards-based progress report was originally scheduled for next school year at all elementary schools, but the timeline has been delayed in order to more fully communicate the change to the community. Full implementation is now scheduled for fall 2012.

The standards on the revised progress report are based on standards students learn at each grade level. During the field test, teachers have reported that as a result of using the standards-based progress report, they have become more familiar with all of the standards that students are expected to learn in our Program of Studies. Teacher teams have frequent conversations about student learning, assessments, and the best way to determine what students have learned. The goal is to create an instrument that makes reporting to parents more consistent across the county.

The project team has worked closely with the Department of Information Technology in the development of the new standards-based progress report. Since the new progress report will be completed online and as part of the new student information system, the Department of Information Technology will be able to evaluate each school's ability to complete the progress report online. According to the FCPS computer inventory, most computers in FCPS meet the minimum requirements of the new student information system. Where that is not the case, computers will be upgraded or replaced in order to provide teachers with the tools they need. It is anticipated that few schools will need upgrades at this time.

Dean:

As I've advocated in the past, is it possible to develop a summary matrix that delineates your decision-making process (e.g., options considered, pros/cons, factors that held the most weight)? (See below.) Also, can you expand upon the notion that the \$15M in renovation and building costs noted in your key points will be covered with the construction reserve and existing bond authority? How much is in the reserve and what for what purposes can it be used? I think the afore-mentioned information would be helpful to all interested parties.

VI. IMPLEMENTING CONSIDERATIONS AND PROCEDURES Numerous factors may be considered when consolidating schools, redistricting school boundaries, or adopting pupil assignment plans. The following examples of these factors are not presented in priority order. Any or all of these factors may be relevant in a particular consolidation, redistricting, or assignment plan: the proximity of schools to student residences; projected school enrollment and capacity; walking distances; busing times and costs; walking and busing safety; natural and man-made geographic features; the impact on neighborhoods; school feeder alignments; contiguous school attendance areas; long-range capital plans; the socioeconomic characteristics of school populations; the distribution of programs and resources; the overall impact on families and students; and comparative long-term costs.

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
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
